9	Relating to Houston County; to provide for contracting
10	of police services by a municipality with the Sheriff of
11	Houston County; and to provide for compensation and

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Any municipality within Houston County may
15	contract for police services with the sheriff of the county.
16	The contract may include the enforcement by the sheriff and
17	his or her duly commissioned deputies of all laws within the
18	corporate limits and police jurisdiction of the municipality,
19	including municipal ordinances, and the arrest or citation of
20	any offenders as if the sheriff and his or her deputies were
21	duly constituted police officers of the municipality.
22	Section 2. A municipality entering into a contract with
23	the sheriff for police services shall pay to the county
24	treasury a sum sufficient to provide the necessary manpower
25	and equipment as mutually agreed upon by the municipal
26	governing body, the sheriff of the county, and the county
27	commission.
28	Section 3. The county governing body may receive from

the municipality within the county money for police services 29 30 and may expend funds for police services in the contracting municipality, including the police jurisdiction of the 31 32 municipality. 33 Section 4. Each contract between the sheriff and the 34 contracting municipality shall be with the consent and 35 approval of the sheriff and the county commission. 36 Section 5. The sheriff and his or her duly commissioned 37 deputies shall retain the legal and constitutional immunity afforded to each of them by law. 38 39 Section 6. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed. 40 Section 7. This act shall become effective on the first 41 42 day of the third month following its passage and approval by

the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
