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#### SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, the department or agency using the services of a state law enforcement officer, who is injured while on duty and the injury is a result of the state law enforcement officer acting within the scope of his or her job duties, is required to compensate the state law enforcement officer throughout the officer's period of recovery at the normal rate of compensation in effect for the officer at the time of injury.

Also under existing law, any active or contributing member of the Employees' Retirement System of Alabama or the Teachers' Retirement System of Alabama may purchase up to two years of service credit for time he or she was receiving worker's compensation benefits and was absent from work due to a work related and compensable injury.

This bill would provide that a county or municipality using the services of a county or municipal law enforcement officer or firefighter, who is injured while on duty as a result of acting within the scope of his or her job duties, is required to purchase a certain amount of service credit in the retirement system on behalf of the county or municipal law enforcement officer or firefighter for the period



of time that the law enforcement officer or firefighter was absent from work and receiving worker's compensation benefits.

Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective with regard to a local entity unless approved by the local entity or until, and only as long as, the Legislature appropriates funds or provides for a local source of revenue.

Relating to county and municipal law enforcement officers; to amend Section 36-27-58.1, Code of Alabama 1975,

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 66
- 67 Section 1. Section 36-27-58.1, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows: 68
- 69 "\$36-27-58.1

(a) Notwithstanding any other laws, any active and 70 71 contributing member of the Employees' Retirement System of Alabama or Teachers' Retirement System of Alabama may purchase 72 up to two years of service credit for the time he or she was 73 74 receiving benefits pursuant to the Alabama Workers' 75 Compensation Act, commencing with Section 25-5-1, and was 76 absent from work due to a work related and compensable injury; 77 provided that the member returned to work with his or her 78 covered employer within one year following cessation of 79 workers' compensation benefits. The Board of Control of the 80 Employees' Retirement System and the Board of Control of the 81 Teachers' Retirement System shall adopt rules and regulations 82 for the administration of this section including verification of the service that the member desires to purchase credit for 83 84 in the system. The member shall receive credit for the service

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when he or she remits to the system the contributions required
by subsection (b). Notwithstanding the foregoing language, no
member of the Employees' Retirement System or Teachers'

Retirement System shall be eligible to receive credit for any
period of time that the member is already credited with in the
system or in any other retirement plan, with the exception of
the federal Social Security program.

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- (b) Any member who is eligible to purchase service credit in the Employees' Retirement System or Teachers'

  Retirement System under subsection (a) shall pay to the Secretary-Treasurer of the system within two years from the end of the disability period for which credit is sought for the claimed service, a lump sum equal to the full actuarially required cost for each year of service credit purchased as determined by the actuary for the system.
- 100 (c) A county or municipality that employs a law enforcement officer or firefighter who is eligible to purchase 101 102 service credit in the Employees' Retirement System or 103 Teachers' Retirement System under subsection (a) shall 104 purchase the service credit for the law enforcement officer or 105 firefighter pursuant to subsection (b). The terms "law 106 enforcement officer" and "firefighter" mean the same as those 107 terms are defined by 36-27-59."

Section 2. The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective with regard to a local entity unless

116	Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first
117	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
118	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
