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4 SYNOPSIS:

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5 Under existing workers' compensation law, an 6 occupational disease is not considered to include a 7 mental illness, including post-traumatic stress disorder 8 (PTSD), unless a physical injury accompanies the mental 9 illness.

10 This bill would require certain benefits be 11 provided to first responders who suffer from work-related 12 PTSD, including reimbursement for certain out-of-pocket 13 treatment expenses and paid time off for employed first 14 responders for treatment. It would provide eligibility 15 requirements for participants to receive the benefits.

16 This bill would authorize a fund to disburse the 17 benefits, to be established by the Alabama League of 18 Municipalities and regulated by the Secretary of the 19 Department of Labor.

20 This bill would also exempt paid benefits from21 state income tax liability.

Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 23 2022 prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect 24 would be to require a new or increased expenditure of 25 local funds from becoming effective with regard to a 26 local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote 27 unless: it comes within one of a number of specified 28 exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the



29	Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local
30	source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.
31	The purpose or effect of this bill would be to
32	require a new or increased expenditure of local funds
33	within the meaning of the amendment. If this bill is not
34	enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective with
35	regard to a local entity or until, and only as long as,
36	the Legislature appropriates funds or provides for a
37	local source of revenue.

42	AN ACT
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44	Relating to first responders; to require certain
45	benefits be made available to first responders suffering from
46	work-related post-traumatic stress disorder; to make a certain
47	leave benefit available to employed first responders; to
48	authorize the Secretary of the Department of Labor to regulate
49	a fund established by the Alabama League of Municipalities to
50	provide the benefits payable to first responders; to exempt
51	benefit payments from the fund from state income tax; and to
52	have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or
53	increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of
54	Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of
55	2022.
56	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:



57 Section 1. For the purposes of this act, the following terms have the following meanings: 58 (1) AUTHORIZED TREATING PHYSICIAN. A licensed 59 clinical psychologist or board-certified psychiatrist licensed 60 to practice in this state and with experience diagnosing PTSD, 61 62 utilizing an evaluation that includes symptom validity testing 63 and other procedures to rule out the presence of malingering 64 PTSD by using established guidelines and criteria. (2) BENEFITS. The coverage provided under this act 65 as described in Section 3(b) through (d). 66 67 (3) COVERED PARTICIPANT. A first responder whose annual premium has been paid in full into the fund. 68 (4) EMPLOYER. The employing municipality or fire 69 70 district entity which employs participants. (5) FIRST RESPONDER: Any of the following: 71 72 a. CAREER FIREFIGHTER. Any individual employed by a 73 municipality or a fire district who has obtained certification as a firefighter through, and as defined by, the Alabama 74 Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission. 75 76 b. VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER. Any individual who is an 77 active member of a volunteer or combination career and volunteer fire department, as recognized by the Alabama 78 Forestry Commission, regardless of whether the individual is 79 certified as a volunteer firefighter through, and as defined 80 81 by, the Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and 82 Education Commission, who may or may not receive remuneration for firefighting activities, but is not offered typical 83 employment benefits, including health insurance coverage. 84 Page 3



85 c. OFFICER. A law enforcement officer certified by the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission 86 87 and employed by a municipality. (6) FUND. A legal entity established by the Alabama 88 League of Municipalities to administer the benefits provided 89 90 for in this act, subject to rules adopted by the Department of 91 Labor. 92 (7) GOVERNING BODY. The board, authority, or individuals designated by the Alabama League of Municipalities 93 to administer the fund. 94 95 (8) POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER (PTSD). A mental health condition that meets the diagnostic criteria in the 96 Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Fifth 97 98 Edition, published by the American Psychiatric Association. (9) QUALIFYING EVENT. An isolated and 99 100 extraordinarily traumatic event involving a first responder 101 acting within the line and scope of duty and that includes the first responder satisfying either of the following: 102 a. Witnessing or being directly engaged in actions 103 resulting in the death of an individual or individuals on the 104 105 scene of an event. b. Witnessing or being directly engaged in actions, 106 during or in rapid emergency response immediately after the 107 occurrence, that resulted in injuries of such an extraordinary 108 109 and severe nature that they lead directly to the death of an 110 individual or individuals due to the injuries on the way to, or no more than 48 hours after, reaching a hospital for 111 112 initial treatment.



113 (10) SECRETARY. The Secretary of the Department of 114 Labor.

(11) VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT. A group of area residents organized to provide fire protection and recognized by the Alabama Forestry Commission as a volunteer fire department.

119 (12) VOLUNTEER PARTICIPANT. A first responder whose120 annual premium has been paid in full into the fund.

121 Section 2. The secretary shall be responsible for 122 the regulation of the fund as it relates to the requirements of this act, and he or she shall adopt rules, including, but 123 not limited to, investment policies for any monies held by the 124 fund in furtherance of this act. Provided, however, nothing in 125 126 this act shall limit or restrict the governing body from providing additional benefits to some or all first responders 127 on matters outside the scope of this act. 128

129 Section 3. (a) To claim benefits under this act, a 130 covered participant or volunteer participant must satisfy all 131 of the following:

132 (1) Experiences a qualifying event during the
133 12-month period immediately preceding the date the first claim
134 for benefits is submitted.

(2) Agrees that the employer or volunteer fire
department is not liable under Chapter 5, Title 25, Code of
Alabama 1975, to the covered participant or volunteer
participant who elects to receive benefits under this act. The
exemption from liability provided in this subdivision is based



140 on the specific diagnosis for which the covered participant or 141 volunteer participant elects to receive benefits. 142 (3) Participates in an applicable peer support event, conducted by a certified peer support member where the 143 covered participant or volunteer participant received a 144 debriefing, defusing, or coaching session in accordance with 145 Section 36-21-14, Code of Alabama 1975. 146 147 (4) Receives certification from an authorized treating physician providing both of the following: 148 149 a. That the covered participant or volunteer 150 participant has been diagnosed with PTSD and that the disorder resulted solely from his or her involvement in a qualifying 151 152 event that occurred in the course of his or her employment, or 153 in the case of a volunteer participant, during the course of his or her activities with a volunteer fire department, and 154 155 not from an event or events that occurred outside the line and 156 scope of, or prior to or after, his or her employment or 157 activities with a volunteer fire department.

b. That the treatment, including therapy orcounseling, is medically necessary.

160 (5) Authorizes the governing body to communicate 161 with the authorized treating physician for the limited and 162 sole purpose of confirming PTSD treatment to the extent 163 necessary to verify claims for benefits pursuant to 164 subsections (b) through (d).

(b) The fund shall reimburse a covered participant or volunteer participant currently employed by an employer or working with a volunteer fire department, respectively, for



any co-payment or deductible not covered by the covered participant or volunteer participant's health insurance and paid by the covered participant or volunteer participant for the treatment of PTSD. The total co-payment or deductible benefits that a covered participant or volunteer participant may receive may not exceed fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) during his or her lifetime.

(c) (1) The fund shall reimburse a covered participant or volunteer participant currently employed by an employer or working with a volunteer fire department for travel for PTSD treatment.

179 (2) The reimbursement shall be per mile for a round
180 trip at the current standard mileage rate set by the Internal
181 Revenue Service for medical care for income tax deduction if
182 the travel meets all of the following conditions:

183 a. The purpose is to visit an authorized treating184 physician for PTSD treatment.

b. The mileage, one way, between the covered or
volunteer participant's residence and the authorized treating
physician is at least 25 miles.

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c. The travel is not outside the State of Alabama.

(d) An employer covered by this act shall provide a covered participant who is employed full time by the employer up to an additional 80 working hours of paid leave, per claim related to a specific event, to seek treatment for PTSD.

193 (1) Any leave taken to seek treatment for PTSD shall194 be without any loss of pay, shall be in addition to all types



195 of leave otherwise applicable under the employer's policies, 196 including sick leave, personal leave, and annual vacation.

197 (2) Any leave taken to seek treatment for PTSD shall
198 not be used by the employer as a factor in any performance
199 evaluation given to the covered participant or any
200 disciplinary action required under the employer's policies to
201 be administered to the covered participant.

Section 4. (a) The governing body shall establish the annual premium for each calendar year using an actuarial study and shall have these rates approved by the secretary to ensure adequate funding for the fund. The computation of premium amounts shall be subject to generally accepted adjustments for insurance underwriting.

(b) All employers shall pay the applicable annual
premium into the fund for all eligible participants in their
employment by December 31 of each calendar year in order to
provide coverage for the following calendar year.

(c) (1) A volunteer fire department is not requiredto provide coverage under this act for volunteer firefighters.

(2) A volunteer firefighter may elect to pay the premium into the fund by December 31 of each calendar year, at his or her own expense, in order to provide coverage for the following calendar year.

(3) Nothing in this subsection shall prevent a volunteer fire department, regional association of volunteer fire departments, a municipality, or any combination of these from optionally contributing in part or in whole to the premium of an individual volunteer firefighter.



(d) The annual premium paid into the fund is fullyearned and is nonrefundable.

225 (e) If a covered participant leaves eligible employment or retires during a covered year, the employer is 226 not entitled to any refund of any portion of the paid premium 227 228 for that calendar year. If a volunteer participant 229 discontinues service with a volunteer fire department during a 230 covered year, the volunteer participant, or in the case of a volunteer fire department that has paid or contributed to the 231 volunteer participant's premium, is not entitled to any refund 232 233 of any portion of the paid premium for that calendar year.

(f) If a covered participant transfers to other eligible employment with a different employer, the new employer shall not be required to pay the premium on that participant until the current calendar year's coverage expires with the previous employer.

(g) A covered participant or volunteer participant is no longer entitled to any benefits if he or she resigns, is terminated, or retires from eligible employment with an employer. A volunteer participant is no longer entitled to any benefits if he or she is no longer associated with a volunteer fire department or is otherwise ineligible to serve as a volunteer firefighter.

(h) In the event a covered participant is employed
by multiple eligible employers simultaneously, the primary
employer shall be responsible for the requirements of this
act. The primary employer shall be identified as the employer



250 who provides primary health insurance benefits to the 251 participant.

252 Section 5. (a) Any monies received by a covered 253 participant or volunteer participant pursuant to this act, to 254 any extent the amounts are included in the federal adjusted 255 gross income of the taxpayer, shall be excluded from taxable 256 income for state income tax purposes.

(b) Any monies received by the fund as premiums for the coverage provided by this act may not be subject to any premium taxes otherwise required by law.

(c) The reimbursement and benefits requirements of
this act shall not apply to PTSD resulting from events
occurring prior to the effective date of this act.

263 Section 6. The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds 264 265 within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of 266 Alabama of 2022. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it 267 will not become effective with regard to a local entity unless approved by the local entity or until, and only as long as, 268 269 the Legislature appropriates funds or provides for a local 270 source of revenue.

271 Section 7. This act shall become effective January 272 1, 2024, following its passage and approval by the Governor, 273 or its otherwise becoming law.
