20	Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this act, a "food
21	pantry" is a charitable, nonprofit organization which
22	collects, purchases, or otherwise accumulates items for
23	distribution without any charge for charitable purposes.

(b) Any food pantry in Cullman County is exempt from payment of all state, county, and municipal sales and use taxes on the purchase of items used for charitable purposes, provided the food pantry has been granted status as a tax exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the federal

30	salary or expenses for the performance of any duties related
31	to its charitable operations.
32	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
33	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
34	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
