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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, when a driver license is
6	renewed, the license is valid for a period of four
7	years from the expiration date of the immediately
8	preceding license.
9	This bill would authorize a licensee to renew
10	his or her license for a period of four or eight years,
11	and would further provide for the fee for the issuance
12	of the license.

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19	Relating to driver licenses; to amend Section 32-6-1,
20	Section 32-6-4, as last amended by Act 2022-300, 2022 Regular
21	Session, Section 32-6-5, Section 32-6-6, as last amended by
22	Act 2022-300, 2022 Regular Session, and Section 32-6-6.1, Code
23	of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the renewal of a
24	driver license; to provide for an eight-year renewal period of
25	driver licenses; and to provide for the required fee for the
26	issuance of an eight-year driver license.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
28	Section 1. Section 32-6-1, Section 32-6-4, as last

amended by Act 2022-300, 2022 Regular Session, Section 32-6-5,

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30 Section 32-6-6, as last amended by Act 2022-300, 2022 Regular Session, and Section 32-6-6.1, Code of Alabama 1975, are 31 32 amended to read as follows: 33 "\$32-6-1 (a) Every personindividual, except those specifically 34 35 exempted by statutory enactment, shall procure obtain a 36 driver's driver license before driving a motor vehicle upon the highways of this state. Every new resident of the State of 37 Alabamathis state shall procureobtain an Alabama 38 39 driver'sdriver license within 30 days after establishing residence in this state. 40 (b) (1) Each original driver's driver license issued to 41 42 a personan individual born in a year ending in an odd number 43 shall expire on the second anniversary of the licensee's birth date occurring in an odd-numbered calendar year after the date 44 45 on which the application for the license was filed, and each 46 original driver'sdriver license issued to a personan 47 individual born in a year ending with an even number shall 48 expire on the second anniversary of the licensee's birth date 49 occurring in an even-numbered calendar year after the date on 50 which the application for the license was filed; provided, that if. If the license issued would expire in less than 24 51 52 months from the date on which the application for the license was filed, the expiration date of such the license is hereby 53 54 extended for an additional period of two years. After the expiration of an original driver's driver license, all 55 56 subsequent renewals, at the discretion of the licensee, shall



57 be for a period of four or eight years from the specified 58 expiration date of the immediately preceding license, 59 regardless of when the renewal shall be is issued. 60 (2) Every driver's driver license issued under this article may be renewed at the end of the license period 61 62 without examination upon application and payment of the fee. 63 For the purpose of renewal of a driver's driver license, the 64 Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall mail renewal notices to each licensee 30 days after expiration date if the 65 driver's driver license has not been renewed. A grace period of 66 67 60 days after expiration date of a driver'sdriver license shall exist for the purpose of driver'sdriver license renewal 68 and the driver's driver license shall be valid for this time 69 70 period. The applicant shall apply for a driver's driver license 71 anytime during a period beginning 180 days before the expiration date of the then current license until three years 72 73 after the expiration date of the license. Notwithstanding any 74 other provision of law, an active duty member of the U.S. 75 Armed Forces is not subject to the 180-day limit if he or she 76 can show proof to the licensing official that he or she is 77 unable to renew during the 180-day period due to deployment. 78 Failure to make application for renewal within the specified 79 time shall result in the applicant being required to take, and 80 successfully pass, a written examination and driving test as 81 administered by the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency. If any person's birthday is February 29, the first day of March 82 following shall be regarded as his or her birthday for the 83 84 purposes of this section.



85 (c) The Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall make 86 available to any resident of this state who does not hold a 87 valid Alabama driver'sdriver license a nondriver 88 identification card to be used for identification purposes only. The nondriver identification card shall be issued only 89 upon application of the nondriver and shall be similar to the 90 91 driver's driver license; except, that it shall bear the word 92 "nondriver" in prominent letters on the face of the 93 identification card. Each nondriver identification card shall bear thereon contain a distinguishing number assigned to the 94 95 nondriver and a color photograph of the nondriver, as well as 96 the name, birth date, residence address, and a brief 97 description of the nondriver who, for the purpose of 98 identification, shall immediately upon receipt thereof, 99 endorse his or her usual signature in ink upon the card in the space provided thereon, unless a facsimile of the nondriver 100 101 signature appears thereon on the license. The same degree of 102 proof of identification required of applicants for driver's 103 driver licenses in this state shall be required of applicants for nondriver identification cards." 104

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"§32-6-4

(a) Upon the installation of a system for the issuance of driver licenses and nondriver identification cards with color photographs of licensees and nondrivers-thereon, all initial Alabama licenses and nondriver identification cards and renewals of licenses issued in this state shall be issued in the following manner:

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(1) The individual shall apply under oath to the



Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, for an initial Alabama driver license or nondriver identification card and to the judge of probate or license commissioner of the county of his or her residence for the renewal of a license or nondriver identification card upon a form <u>whichthat</u> shall be provided by the Secretary of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency.

(2) For the renewal of a driver license or nondriver identification card, the judge of probate or license commissioner shall take a color photograph of the licensee with equipment to be furnished by the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency to be attached to each application.

(b)(1) For the purpose of defraying the cost of issuing 124 driver licenses or nondriver identification cards with 125 126 containing color photographs of the licensee or nondriver 127 thereon, except as provided in Section 32-6-4.1, the Alabama 128 State Law Enforcement Agency, judge of probate, or license commissioner shall collect for each license or identification 129 130 card the required fee for a four-year license, an eight-year 131 license, or ana nondriver identification card, and the Alabama 132 State Law Enforcement Agency, judge of probate, or license 133 commissioner shall give the licensee a driver license or 134 identification card. For purposes of this section, in addition 135 to any other fees provided by law, the required fee for a 136 four-year license shall be thirty dollars (\$30), and the 137 required fee for an eight-year license shall be seventy-five 138 dollars (\$75).

139 (2) Except as provided by rules of the Secretary of the
140 Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, the nondriver



141 identification card shall bear no expiration date for any 142 person 62 years of age or older.

143 (2)(3) A qualified student, as defined in Section 144 16-28-40(b), is exempt from the driver license issuance fee 145 required by this section.

(c) (1) Any male applicant who applies for a driver
license or a learner license or a renewal of the license who
is at least 18 years of age, but less than 26 years of age,
shall be registered in compliance with the requirements of
Section 3 of the Military Selective Service Act, 50 U.S.C.
App. 453, as amended.

152 (2) The Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall 153 forward in an electronic format the necessary personal 154 information of the applicants identified in this subsection to 155 the Selective Service System. The applicant's signature on the 156 application shall serve as an indication that the applicant 157 either has already registered with the Selective Service 158 System or that he is authorizing the agency to forward to the 159 Selective Service System the necessary information for 160 registration. The agency shall notify the applicant at the 161 time of application that his signature constitutes consent to 162 registration with the Selective Service System, if he is not already registered." 163

(a) (1) At the close of business on Monday of each week,
when any application has been received or when any temporary
instruction permit provided for in this article has been
issued, the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA) or



169 judge of probate or Department of Public Safety receiving the 170 application or issuing the permit shall prepare a report of 171 the same upon a form which shall be provided by the Director 172 of Public Safety Secretary of ALEA. One copy of the report, together with all applications received and copies of all 173 permits issued, shall be forwarded to the Director of Public 174 175 Safety ALEA and one copy shall be retained by the judge of 176 probate.

177 (2) On the tenth day of every month except October, 178 November, and December, the judge of probate and the 179 Department of Public Safety ALEA shall prepare a report 180 showing the number of applications received and permits issued 181 and the amount of fees received during the previous calendar 182 month.

183 (3) In the months of October, November, and December, 184 the report shall be prepared on the twentieth day of the 185 month. One copy of a report shall be forwarded to the Director 186 of Public Safety, one to the Comptroller, and one to the <u>State</u> 187 Treasurer, and the judge of probate shall retain a copy.

188 (b) (1) The judge of probate shall also at that time 189 deliver remit to the <u>State</u> Treasurer the amount of all the 190 fees collected, less <u>an administrative fee which shall be as</u> 191 follows:

a. <u>oneOne</u> dollar fifty cents (\$1.50) for each <u>four-year</u>
driver license or identification card issued, which sum shall
be retained by him or her.

195 <u>b. Three dollars (\$3) for each eight-year driver</u> 196 <u>license issued.</u>



197 (2) Except in counties where the judge of probate is compensated by fees, each one dollar fifty cents (\$1.50) the 198 199 amount retained by the judge of probate shall be paid into the 200 public highway and traffic fund of the county. 201 (3) In counties where the judge of probate is 202 compensated by fees, two-fifths of each one dollar fifty cents 203 (\$1.50) administrative fee retained by the judge of probate 204 shall be for his or her own use, and no other or further 205 charge shall be made by him or her for services rendered in 206 taking or receiving applications or issuing permits, and the 207 remaining three-fifths shall be paid into the public highway and traffic fund of the county. This section, providing for 208 209 the allocation of the one dollar fifty cents (\$1.50) 210 administrative fee retained by the judge of probate in 211 counties where the judge of probate is compensated by fees, 212 shall not repeal any local statutes or general statutes of 213 local application providing for a different allocation of the 214 one dollar fifty cents (\$1.50) amount retained.

215 (c) The funds remitted to the State Treasurer under 216 this section, except for that portion representing five 217 dollars (\$5) for each license or card issued, shall be 218 deposited to the credit of the General Fund and shall be 219 appropriated for public safety use. The Department of Public 220 Safety Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall deliver the 221 amount of all the fees collected by the department agency to 222 the State Treasurer less one dollar fifty cents (\$1.50) an administrative fee for each driver's driver license or 223 224 identification card issued, which shall be remitted to the

225 county general fund in the county of issuance on the tenth day 226 of the following month. The administrative fee shall be one 227 dollar fifty cents (\$1.50) for each four-year driver license 228 or identification card issued, and three dollars (\$3) for each 229 eight-year driver license issued. From the funds remitted to 230 the State Treasurer, the portion representing five dollars 231 (\$5) shall be deposited into the Highway Traffic Safety Fund 232 for the Department of Public Safety which is hereby created 233 within the State Treasury to the credit of the Public Safety Fund administered by ALEA, and shall be used. All money 234 235 deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the Highway Traffic Safety Fund for the Department of Public Safety shall 236 237 be expended for law enforcement purposes. No money shall be 238 withdrawn or expended from the fund for any law enforcement 239 purpose unless the money has been allotted and budgeted in accordance with Article 4, commencing with Section 41-4-80, of 240 Chapter 4 of Title 41, and only in the amounts and for the law 241 242 enforcement purposes provided by the Legislature in the 243 general appropriations bill."

245 (a) Each driver license issued by the Alabama State Law 246 Enforcement Agency, except temporary permits or other special 247 circumstances as determined by the Secretary of the Alabama 248 State Law Enforcement Agency, shall contain a distinguishing 249 number assigned to the licensee and a color photograph of the 250 licensee, the name, birthdatedate of birth, address, and a description of the licensee, who, for. For the purpose of 251 252 identification and as a condition precedent to the validity of



253 the license, immediately upon receipt of the license, <u>the</u> 254 <u>licensee</u> shall endorse his or her usual or regular signature 255 upon the license in the space provided, unless a facsimile of 256 the licensee's signature appears on the license.

(b) A photo driver license and photo nondriver
identification card as provided in Section 32-6-4 shall have a
photo core that meets the minimum width and length dimensions
specified in ANSI standards X4.13-1971 and ANSI standard CR80,
plus or minus 1/4 inch.

262 (c) In addition to all current and existingany other 263 fees, the agency may charge an additional fee to recover the cost of producing and issuing photo driver licenses and photo 264 265 nondriver identification cards. The fee may not exceed ten 266 cents (\$.10) over the actual cost of producing and issuing the 267 license or card including the cost of materials, labor costs, 268 telecommunications costs, computer costs, postage, and any 269 other costs incurred in producing and issuing a license or 270 card.

271 (c) (d) A driver license issued to a qualifying student 272 described in Section 16-28-40(b) shall be exempt from any fees 273 under this sectiondivision.

274 (d) (e) Revenues collected under this section shall be 275 used by the agency for the sole purpose of this program, and 276 any excess shall revert to the General Fund at the end of each 277 fiscal year."

279 <u>(a)</u> In addition to any other fees imposed for issuance 280 of a driver license and photo nondriver identification card,



281	the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall impose an
282	additional fee of fifty cents (\$.50) as follows for each
283	driver license and photo nondriver identification card issued,
284	except for a driver license issued to a qualifying student, as
285	defined in Section 16-28-40(b)(2)
286	(1) For the issuance of a four-year driver license or
287	photo nondriver identification card, a fee of fifty cents
288	(\$.50).
289	(2) For the issuance of an eight-year driver license, a
290	fee of one dollar (\$1).
291	(b) The fee collected under this section shall be
292	allocated and appropriated to the Alabama Veterans Living
293	Legacy Trust Fund created by the Alabama Veterans Living
294	Legacy Act of 2008, Division 2, commencing with Section
295	16-44A-50, of Article 2 of Chapter 44A, and expenditures of
296	the fee pursuant to the master plan for facilities, programs,
297	and outreach provided by that division and its related
298	programs."
299	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first

300 day of the third month following its passage and approval by 301 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
