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4 SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, the Volunteer Rescue Squad 5 6 Tuition Reimbursement Act of 2018, provides tuition 7 reimbursement for students who successfully complete an Emergency Medical Technician or Paramedic certification 8 9 program offered by a member institution of the Alabama 10 Community College System or the Alabama Fire College 11 and contract to provide three years of service to a volunteer rescue squad or fire department. 12

13This bill would decrease the required contracted14for service time after graduation and licensing from15three years to two years.

16 This bill would expand the program to include 17 students who contract and provide service to an 18 ambulance service.

19This bill would provide for exclusions from20reimbursement.

This bill would increase the maximum amount of operational expenses reimbursed by the program to the Alabama Community College System for administering the program from two percent to 10 percent of the funding for the program per fiscal year.

This bill would also provide for the retroactive reimbursement of certain related necessary fees and required expenses.

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35	Relating to the Volunteer Rescue Squad Tuition
36	Reimbursement Act of 2018; to amend Sections 22-18-60,
37	22-18-61, and 22-18-64, Code of Alabama 1975, to decrease the
38	required contracted for service time after graduation and
39	licensing from three years to two years; to expand the program
40	to include students who contract and provide service to
41	ambulance services; to provide exclusions from reimbursement;
42	and to increase the amount of operational expenses reimbursed
43	to the Alabama Community College System; and to add Section
44	22-18-61.1 to the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for the
45	retroactive reimbursement of certain fees and expenses.
46	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
47	Section 1. Sections 22-18-60, 22-18-61, and 22-18-64 of
48	the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
49	"§22-18-60
50	For the purposes of this article, the following terms
51	shall have the following meanings:
52	(1) ACCS. The Alabama Community College System.
53	(2) AMBULANCE SERVICE. An ambulance service located in
54	this state which is a member of the Alabama Association of
55	Ambulance Services.
56	(2) (3) ASSOCIATIONS. The Alabama Association of Rescue



57	Squads <del>or</del> , the Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire
58	Departments, or the Alabama Association of Ambulance Services.
59	(3) (4) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL (EMSP). All
60	recognized levels of personnel licensed by the Alabama
61	Department of Public Health, who have met all primary and/or
62	or renewal educational requirements, or both, set by the
63	Alabama Department of Public Health, and <u>who</u> are allowed to
64	provide medical care within the level of their scope of
65	practice granted by the Office of Emergency Medical Services
66	(OEMS) within the Alabama Department of Public Health.
67	(4)(5) FIRE COLLEGE. The Alabama Fire College.
68	(5)(6) STUDENT. A student enrolled in an emergency
69	medical services certification program at a member institution
70	of the <u>Alabama Community College System</u> <u>ACCS</u> , the <u>Alabama Fire</u>
71	College fire college, or the University of South Alabama.
72	(7) TUITION COSTS. Includes the actual cost of tuition
73	and fees required to complete an approved course of
74	instruction for EMSP certification, as determined by each
75	eligible educational institution.
76	(6) (8) VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD. A volunteer rescue squad
77	located in <del> the State of Alabama and this state which</del> is a
78	member of the Alabama Association of Rescue Squads.
79	(7) (9) VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT. A volunteer fire
80	department located in the State of Alabama and this state
81	$\underline{which}$ is a member of the Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire
82	Departments."

84	(a) The Alabama Community College System ACCS, the



85 Alabama Fire College, and the University of South 86 Alabama, in consultation with the associations, shall jointly 87 develop and administer a student tuition reimbursement program 88 for students that agree in the form of an enforceable who contract agreement, to provide two years of emergency medical 89 90 services for volunteer rescue squads-or, volunteer fire 91 departments in Alabama, or ambulance services after becoming a 92 licensed EMSP subject to the student agreeing to provide three years of service to a volunteer rescue squad or volunteer fire 93 94 department. 95 (b) (1) Tuition reimbursement under this article shall be the actual cover tuition costs paid by the student 96 97 associated with obtaining to complete an approved course of 98 instruction for certification. Tuition reimbursement may also 99 cover the repayment of tuition costs provided to a student by an association or members of an association to pay any of his 100 101 or her eligible tuition costs. 102 (2) Tuition reimbursement under this article shall not 103 reimburse a student for any tuition costs covered by grants or 104 other monetary awards provided to a student including, but not 105 limited to, federal education grants and scholarships, as 106 determined by the ACCS. 107 (3) Tuition costs shall not be reimbursed until the 108 student provides ACCS and the associations with documentation

109 that he or she has successfully completed the approved course 110 of instruction, proof of passing the certification exam, 111 production of a valid EMSP license from the Alabama Department 112 of Public Health and a contractual agreement to comply with



113 the service requirements.

(c) In the event that a tuition reimbursement recipient 114 115 fails to meet the service requirements for any reason other 116 than extreme hardship as defined within the joint agreement required in Section 22-18-64(b), the individual shall be 117 118 deemed to have breached the underlying contract and shall be 119 liable in the form of monetary damages to the state for the 120 immediate repayment of the total tuition amount costs 121 reimbursed, plus interest at the rate of eight percent. The associations shall notify ACCS of recipients who fail to meet 122 123 the service requirements."

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"\$22-18-64

(a) The ACCS shall annually report on the condition and 125 126 accomplishments of the tuition reimbursement program to the 127 Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, President 128 Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Chair of the House Ways and 129 Means Education Committee, the Chair of the Senate Finance and 130 Taxation Education Committee, and the Deputy Director of the 131 Legislative Services Agency, Fiscal Division. The report shall 132 include the number of students participating in the program 133 and the amount of tuition reimbursed for the reporting year. 134 The member institutions of the ACCS, the Fire College fire 135 college, and the University of South Alabama shall provide 136 this information to ACCS for inclusion in the annual report. 137 The report shall be submitted by the fifth legislative day of 138 each regular session of the Legislature.

(b) The ACCS, the <u>Fire College fire college</u>, and the
University of South Alabama shall enter into a joint agreement



141 to implement and administer the tuition reimbursement program, 142 which shall include provisions for ensuring that operational 143 expenses for the program in a fiscal year do not exceed two 10 144 percent of the funding for the program in that fiscal year. 145 The joint agreement shall provide for limiting the acceptance 146 of applications for the program or limiting tuition 147 reimbursements when necessary, or both.

(c) Any monies received for the operations of the
tuition reimbursement program, including repayments, interest,
and penalties paid because of failure to honor service
requirements, shall be used to fund tuition reimbursements."
Section 2. Section 22-18-61.1 is added to the Code of

153 Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

154 \$22-18-61.1

Upon written request by an association or a member of an association, the ACCS may retroactively consider reimbursement of actual tuition costs, excluding required fees, provided by the association or its members to a student to pay his or her eligible tuition costs.

160 Section 3. Section 1 of this act shall become effective 161 on the first day of the third month following its passage and 162 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law. 163 Section 2 of this act shall become effective immediately 164 following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its 165 otherwise becoming law.
