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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Existing law does not provide a financial
6	incentive for an adult learner who has earned some
7	college credits to return to college to complete their
8	degree.
9	This bill would establish the ReEngage Alabama
10	Grant Program, administered through the Alabama
11	Commission on Higher Education, to provide grant award
12	payments to assist eligible adult learners returning t
13	college to complete a degree that is linked to
14	Alabama's high demand workforce needs.
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17	A BILL
18	TO BE ENTITLED
19	AN ACT
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21	To establish the ReEngage Alabama Grant Program; to
22	provide grant award payments to eligible adult learners; to
23	provide eligibility standards, and to provide for
24	administration by the Alabama Commission on Higher Education
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. The purpose of the ReEngage Alabama Grant
27	Program is to do all of the following:

(1) Increase the number of Alabama adults with college

- 30 (2) Encourage adults who have earned some college
- 31 credit hours to return to college, enroll, and complete a
- 32 college degree program that is connected with workforce
- development needs and aligned with Alabama's high demand
- 34 occupations list.
- 35 (3) Provide financial assistance to adult learners of
- 36 the state for postsecondary education in the state.
- 37 Section 2. For the purposes of this act the following
- 38 terms shall have the following meanings:
- 39 (1) ACADEMIC TERM. A portion of an academic year, such
- 40 as a quarter or semester, during which an institution of
- 41 higher education holds classes including, but not limited to,
- 42 fall, winter, spring, or summer semesters.
- 43 (2) ADULT LEARNER. An individual who is 25 years of age
- 44 or older and returning to college.
- 45 (3) ALABAMA RESIDENT. An individual who has been
- 46 classified as an in-state resident by an authorized
- 47 institution, who has established residency within this state
- 48 for at least a 12-month period prior to the beginning of the
- 49 term for which financial assistance is requested, and who is
- in this state for other than a temporary purpose.
- 51 (4) APPROVED INSTITUTION. A state-supported institution
- 52 of higher education or a private nonprofit institution of
- 53 higher education that satisfies all of the following:
- a. Is accredited by the Southern Association of
- 55 Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges.
- b. Is eligible to receive Title IV federal student aid



- 57 program funds.
- c. Maintains its primary headquarters in Alabama.
- 59 (5) AUTHORIZED INSTITUTION. An approved institution
- that files a signed agreement with the commission to comply
- with all rules and procedures of the ReEngage Alabama Grant
- Program as provided by the commission.
- 63 (6) COMMISSION. The Alabama Commission on Higher
- 64 Education.
- 65 (7) CONTINUOUS ENROLLMENT. When an adult learner is
- 66 making academic progress toward degree completion without a
- stop-out in enrollment of more than one consecutive semester
- or quarter, such as Fall/Winter to Spring, Spring to
- 69 Summer/Fall, or Summer to Fall.
- 70 (8) ELIGIBLE PROGRAM. A nonsectarian, secular
- 71 educational program that is aligned with Alabama's high demand
- 72 workforce needs adopted by the Alabama Committee on
- 73 Credentialing and Career Pathways.
- 74 (9) ELIGIBLE STUDENT. An individual who completed the
- 75 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), who is in
- 76 pursuit of his or her first associate or baccalaureate degree,
- 77 who satisfies the criteria set out in this act, and who is
- found to be eligible by rules adopted by the commission.
- 79 (10) GRANT. A financial award by the State of Alabama
- 80 to defray the cost of tuition and mandatory fees to an
- 81 eligible adult learner who is currently enrolled in an
- 82 authorized institution.
- 83 (11) PROGRAM. The ReEngage Alabama Grant Program
- 84 created by this act.



- 85 (12) YEAR. An academic year that shall be divided into 86 Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer terms. The term does not mean 87 calendar or fiscal year.
- Section 3. (a) The program shall be administered by the commission, which may adopt any rules necessary for the administration of the program.
- 91 (b) The commission shall adopt standards for awarding 92 grant payments to an eligible adult learner who satisfies all 93 of the following:
- 94 (1) Is a citizen or a lawful permanent resident of the 95 United States.
- 96 (2) Is a resident of Alabama.
- 97 (3) Has not attended a postsecondary education 98 institution for at least two years prior to their current 99 enrollment.
- Section 4. (a) To be eligible for the grant award, an applicant shall satisfy all of the following:
- (1) Be classified as an undergraduate student with the completion of at least 36 credit hours for an associate degree or at least 72 credit hours for a baccalaureate degree of a college degree program that is connected with workforce development needs and aligned with Alabama's high demand occupations list adopted by the Alabama Committee on Credentialing and Career Pathways.
 - (2) Show proof of residency.

- 110 (3) Have good academic standing as defined by the institution.
- 112 (4) Has been accepted to or is enrolled as a full-time



- or part-time student in an eligible program in an authorized institution leading to an associate or baccalaureate degree and has not attended a postsecondary education institution at
 - (5) Satisfies continuing eligibility each term by enrolling in six hours or more per term continuously as established by the commission.

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least two years prior.

- 120 Section 5. (a) The program shall be used to provide 121 grant award payments for eligible adult learners up to the maximum award amount of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for 122 123 universities and one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) 124 for community colleges per academic semester for a full-time 125 student. Proportional awards shall be given for students 126 taking six to 11 hours and students enrolled in less common 127 academic terms, such as quarters, summer terms, and 128 intersessions.
- terms normally required by the institution for the course of study in which the adult learner is enrolled as long as the student is continuously enrolled until the student receives an associate degree or a baccalaureate degree. The commission shall grant a renewal upon verification that the student remains an eligible student.
- 136 (c) Grant award payments shall be distributed directly
 137 to the approved institution on behalf of the student during
 138 the applicable year.
- 139 (d) The requirements of this act are contingent upon 140 available funding for the program.

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- 141 (e) The commission shall determine the necessary

 142 procedures for awarding grant award payments if the number of

 143 eligible applicants and recipients exceeds available funding.
- 144 (f) Any funds appropriated to the program shall be nonreverting.

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- 146 (g) A percentage of the grant program's appropriations
 147 may be expended for the operation and maintenance of the
 148 program.
 - (h) Each authorized institution that enrolls an adult learner who is eligible for the tuition and mandatory fees benefits provided by this program shall take necessary action to ensure that the student is aware of all other benefits that he or she may be entitled to under any other federal and state educational benefits, and any student grant or scholarship. In order to receive the benefits provided by this program, the student shall take the necessary steps to utilize all of the above benefits.
- Section 6. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
