5	This bill would confirm that centralized motor
6	vehicle registration is specifically prohibited and it
7	is the legislature's intent that motor vehicle
8	registration shall remain at the county level with no
9	centralized motor vehicle registration system provided
10	by any state agency, and would provide for retroactive
11	effect.
12	This bill would also make nonsubstantive,
13	technical revisions to update the existing code
14	language to current style.

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21	Relating to motor vehicles; to amend Section 32-6-65,
22	Code of Alabama 1975, to confirm that centralized motor
23	vehicle registration is specifically prohibited and it is the

26	registration system provided by any state agency; to provide

27 for retroactive effect; and to make nonsubstantive, technical 28 revisions to update the existing code language to current

30 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

31 Section 1. Section 32-6-65, Code of Alabama 1975, is 32 amended to read as follows:

33 "§32-6-65

34 (a) There shall be one uniform motor vehicle 35 registration renewal form to be used statewide. Such The form 36 shall be designed so as to provide for both the transfer of 37 ownership and the registration of the motor vehicle. All receipts shall be sent to the county agencies charged with 38 39 handling motor vehicle registration. Receipts may be provided to the registrant in a tangible format or in an electronic 40 41 format, as prescribed by the department. The state and the 42 county shall capture the color of the motor vehicle in their 43 permanent records. This subsection shall not give the Department of Revenue authority to centralize motor vehicle 44 45 registration. Centralized registration is of motor vehicles, a 46 statewide motor vehicle registration system, or any motor 47 vehicle registration system managed or provided by a state 48 agency are specifically prohibited and it. It is the 49 legislative intent that automotive motor vehicle registration 50 shall remain at the county level.

(b) (1) A penalty of fifteen dollars (\$15) shall be assessed by the official charged with issuing motor vehicle licenses for the late registration of a motor vehicle. "Late registration of a motor vehicle" shall include <u>all of the</u> <u>following:</u>

(1) the failure a. Failure to register the motor

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57 vehicle within 20 calendar days of the date of purchase or 58 acquisition; (2) the failure

59 <u>b. Failure</u> to renew the registration in the designated 60 renewal month; and (3) the failure

61 <u>c. Failure</u> to register the <u>motor</u> vehicle in accordance 62 with the provisions of Section 40-12-262(a).

63 (2) It shall be the duty of all sheriffs, police 64 officers, state troopers, license inspectors, deputy license inspectors, field agents of the Department of Revenue, and 65 other law enforcement officers to arrest any person operating 66 67 a motor vehicle without the current license plate displaying the proper validation decal. Persons apprehended for operating 68 a motor vehicle without the current license plate, upon 69 70 conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction, shall be 71 fined not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25).

(2) (3) Notwithstanding subdivision (1), any person on 72 73 military deployment during any part of his or her designated 74 registration renewal month, except a person with a discharge 75 characterization of dishonorable or other than honorable, who 76 renews his or her motor vehicle registration within 30 77 calendar days from the date the deployment ends shall not be 78 assessed a late registration penalty or associated interest 79 charges. Evidence of military deployment shall be documented 80 using military deployment orders, a government issued 81 Statement of Service letter, Form DD214 Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty, or a letter from the 82 registrant's unit commander certifying the date that his or 83 84 her deployment ended.

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(c) All penalties assessed by this section shall be
distributed in the same manner as motor vehicle licenses and
registration fees are distributed as provided in Sections
40-12-269 and 40-12-270. Portions of Section 40-12-10 as they
may conflict with this section, are hereby repealed and
superseded."

91 Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately 92 following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its 93 otherwise becoming law, and shall apply retroactively to 94 October 1, 2022.
