"(a) Any person shall be strictly liable for civil
damages who causes the injury or damage to any person or
domestic animal as a result of using any trap or similar
device on public land <u>in violation of state laws or rules</u> to
take, capture, or kill any of the fur-bearing animals
protected by the <u>state</u> laws or <u>regulations of this state</u>
rules.

14 "(b) Any person who suffers injury or damage to his 15 <u>or her</u> person or domestic animal as a result of such activity 16 <u>on public land in violation of state laws or rules</u> shall have 17 an action for civil damages and <del>such</del> <u>an</u> aggrieved person need 18 not prove negligence.

19 "(c) The provisions of this This section shall not
20 apply to Lawrence County.

21 "(d) This section is not intended to expand or limit
22 current defenses of state agents or employees."

23 Section 2. This act shall become effective 24 immediately following its passage and approval by the 25 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
