26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to Section 63 of Article IV of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 63 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

"Section 63.

"Every The short title of every bill shall be read on three different days in each house, and no bill shall become a law, unless on its final passage it be read at length, unless the same is dispensed with by unanimous consent, and the vote on final passage shall be taken by yeas and nays, the names of the members voting for and against the same be entered upon the journals, and a majority of each house be recorded thereon as voting in its favor, except as otherwise provided in this Constitution."

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional

amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 1 2 following description of the substance or subject matter of 3 the proposed constitutional amendment: "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 4 5 Alabama of 1901, removing the requirement that every bill be read at length prior to its final passage. 6 "Proposed by Act ." 7 This description shall be followed by the following 8 9 language: 10 "Yes () No ()."
