Relating to a retired certified firefighter with the occupational disease of cancer; to provide supplemental insurance coverage or reimbursement of actual expenses for medical treatment not covered by the health insurance or Medicare coverage of the firefighter if diagnosed within 10 years of retirement, under certain conditions.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. For the purposes of this act, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- (1) CANCER. Cancer that originates as a cancer of the brain, skin, digestive system, hematological system, or genitourinary system.
- (2) EMPLOYER. Any municipality, agency, board, or district that employs paid, certified firefighters to provide emergency and non-emergency fire services to the general public within the boundaries of the State of Alabama.
- (3) OCCUPATIONAL DISEASE. A disease arising out of and in the course of employment which is due to hazards in excess of those ordinarily incident to employment in general and is peculiar to the occupation in which the employee is engaged, without regard to negligence or fault, if any, of the employer.
- (4) RETIRED CERTIFIED FIREFIGHTER. Any person who has obtained certification as a firefighter through and as defined by the Alabama Fire College and Personnel Standards Commission, who has been employed by any employer, as defined by this act, who has had continued service of at least three

years, and who has left that service in accordance with the rules of his or her employer either from service time or due to a disability injury.

Section 2. (a) Except as provided in subsection (c), a retired certified firefighter who is diagnosed with cancer that is considered an occupational disease shall be provided supplemental insurance coverage or reimbursement of his or her actual expenses for medical treatment related to the cancer which is not covered by his or her health insurance or Medicare, if the cancer was diagnosed within 10 years of his or her retirement.

- (b) All costs associated with the supplemental insurance coverage or reimbursement required by this section shall be paid by the employer from which the retired certified firefighter is retired.
- (c) An employer is not required to provide supplemental insurance coverage or compensation under subsection (a) if the cancer was caused by some other means other than the occupation.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
