20	To amend Section 26-24-2, Code of Alabama 1975,
21	relating to the Secretary of Early Childhood Education; to
22	provide for the qualifications of the secretary.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Section 26-24-2 of the Code of Alabama
25	1975, is amended to read as follows:
26	"§26-24-2.

"(a) The department shall be headed by and shall be 1 2 under the direction, supervision, and control of an officer who shall be known and designated as the Secretary of Early 3 Childhood Education. The secretary shall be responsible to the 4 5 Governor for the administration of the department. "(b) The secretary shall be appointed by and shall 6 7 hold office at the pleasure of the Governor. 8 "(1) To be eligible for appointment to the office of 9 secretary, a person shall provide proof of all of the 10 following qualifications: "a. A master's degree, or completion of at least 36 11 hours of post baccalaureate course work, in early childhood 12 13 education or childhood development. "b. Extensive experience in educational supervision 14 15 and management in the areas of early childhood education encompassing birth to eight years of age, inclusive, school 16 readiness, early care education, school improvement, and 17 18 school administration or education administration. "(2) In addition to the qualifications for the 19 20 office of secretary listed in subdivision (1), certification 21 in education administration and supervision is preferred, but 22 not required. "(c) Vacancies in the office of secretary for any 23 24 reason shall be filled by the Governor. 25 "(d) The salary of the secretary shall be fixed by 26 the Governor at a sum comparable to salaries paid similar 27 officers in state government.

"(e) Before entering upon the discharge of duties,
the secretary shall take the constitutional oath of office and
shall execute to the State of Alabama a bond, to be approved
by the Governor, in an amount to be fixed by the Governor, but
not less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), conditioned upon
the faithful performance of his or her duties. The premiums on
the bond shall be paid out of the State Treasury.

"(f) The secretary shall devote full time to the 8 official duties of the office and shall not hold another 9 10 office under the government of the United States, or any other state, or of this state or of any political subdivision 11 thereof, during his or her incumbency in the office. The 12 13 secretary shall not hold any position of trust or profit, the conduct of which shall interfere or be inconsistent with his 14 15 or her duties as secretary pursuant to this article."

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective 17 immediately following its passage and approval by the 18 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
