Relating to fines for certain outstanding traffic violations; to provide a procedure to allow a person to pay fines for certain outstanding traffic violations in installments; to provide for the reinstatement of the suspended driver's license of a person who has been allowed to pay the fines in installments; and to provide for the suspension of the driver's license of a person who fails to comply with the installment plan for payment of outstanding fines for traffic tickets.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) (1) A person who has outstanding fines for a traffic offense that is not included in Article 9, Chapter 5A, Title 32, Code of Alabama 1975, may petition the court that has jurisdiction of the case to pay the outstanding fines in installments. The person shall pay a filing fee in the amount of thirty-five dollars (\$35) to the court in which the petition for payment of outstanding fines in installments is filed.

(b) The court shall set a hearing to determine the financial circumstances of the person and any other relevant information in determining a plan to pay the outstanding fines and release any holds on the driver's license of the person. If the court determines that the petition should be granted, the court shall issue an order allowing the person to pay the outstanding fines in reasonable monthly installments and inform the person of the determination in writing.

allowing payment of the outstanding fines in installments, the court shall notify the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, Driver License Division, of the failure within 30 days after the failure. Upon receipt of the notice, the agency shall immediately issue an order suspending the person's driver's license and privilege to drive effective 30 days after the date of the order of suspension. The order shall be mailed by first class postage to the person's last known address on the records of the agency. Notice shall be deemed received three days after mailing.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
