24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. (a) A person who in good faith, and not
26	for compensation, provides an individual transportation to a
27	health care facility or health care provider is not liable for

any civil damages resulting from any act or omission in

providing transportation, unless the act or omission was the

result of the provider's gross negligence or willful or wanton

misconduct. The immunity provided in this subsection includes

transportation from an individual's residence.

- (b) The immunity provided in subsection (a) does not apply unless the transportation provider has posted in a conspicuous place in his or her vehicle an explanation of the immunity provided in subsection (a).
- (c) Acceptance by the transportation provider of a gratuitous contribution or donation made by the individual receiving transportation services does not constitute a waiver of immunity under this section.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
