8 SYNOPSIS: Under the existing Constitution of Alabama
9 of 1901, as amended, the total of state, county,
10 and municipal ad valorem taxes payable on various
11 classes of taxable property may not exceed a
12 specified percentage of the value of the property,
13 depending upon the type of property.

14 This bill would propose a local
15 constitutional amendment relating to the City of
16 Homewood in Jefferson County, to provide that the
17 existing limits on the amount of ad valorem taxes
18 payable on various classes of taxable property in
19 any one year would not apply.

25 To propose a local constitutional amendment relating
26 to the City of Homewood in Jefferson County, to provide that
27 existing limits on the amount of ad valorem taxes payable on

1 various classes of taxable property in any one year would not
2 apply.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. The following amendment to the
5 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become
6 valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of
7 this act are fulfilled:

8 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

9 With respect to taxable property in the City of
10 Homewood in Jefferson County, the amount of ad valorem taxes
11 payable in one ad valorem tax year on various classes of
12 taxable property shall not be subject to any limitation in
13 subsection (i) of Amendment 373 of the Constitution of Alabama
14 of 1901, now appearing as subsection (i) of Section 217 of the
15 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901,
16 as amended.

17 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment
18 shall be held in accordance with Section 284.01 to the
19 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section
20 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
21 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this
22 state.

23 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall
24 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
25 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the
26 following description of the substance or subject matter of
27 the proposed constitutional amendment:

1 "Relating only to the City of Homewood in Jefferson
2 County, proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama
3 of 1901, to provide that existing limits on the amount of ad
4 valorem taxes payable on various classes of taxable property
5 in any one year would not apply.

6 "Proposed by Act _____"

7 This description shall be followed by the following
8 language:
