4 Section 1. The following amendment to the 5 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become 6 valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of 7 this act are fulfilled:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

9 With respect to taxable property in the City of 10 Homewood in Jefferson County, the amount of ad valorem taxes payable in one ad valorem tax year on various classes of 11 taxable property shall not be subject to any limitation in 12 13 subsection (i) of Amendment 373 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as subsection (i) of Section 217 of the 14 15 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, 16 as amended.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Section 284.01 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

23 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 24 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 25 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 26 following description of the substance or subject matter of 27 the proposed constitutional amendment: "Relating only to the City of Homewood in Jefferson County, proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that existing limits on the amount of ad valorem taxes payable on various classes of taxable property in any one year would not apply.
