23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Sections 32-5B-5 and 32-5B-8 of the Code
25	of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
26	"\$32-5B-5.

1 "Any person violating the provisions of this chapter 2 may shall be fined up to \$25.00 one hundred dollars (\$100). The violation of the provisions of this chapter shall not 3 constitute probable cause for search of the vehicle involved. 4 5 "§32-5B-8. "(a) A person subject to a penalty pursuant to 6 7 Section 32-5B-5, shall not be assessed court costs on a conviction. 8 9 "(b) In any case brought by a law enforcement 10 officer employed by the Department of Public Safety, sixty percent (60%) Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, 60 percent 11 12 of the funds generated shall be allocated to the Department of 13 Public Safety, Law Enforcement Division. The Alabama State Law 14 Enforcement Agency, and the remaining forty 40 percent (40%) 15 of the funds shall be allocated to the State General Fund. "(c) A law enforcement officer may not search or 16 inspect a motor vehicle, its content, the driver, or a 17 18 passenger solely because of a violation of this chapter. "(d) Each state, county, and municipal police 19 20 department must maintain statistical information on traffic 21 stops of this nature on minorities and report that information 22 monthly to the Department of Public Safety and the Attorney General." 23 Section 2. This act shall become effective on 24 25 October 1, 2018, following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
