22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Section 13A-11-240, Code of Alabama 1975,
24	is amended to read as follows:
25	"§13A-11-240.
26	"(a) The word "torture" as used in this article
27	shall mean the act of doing physical injury to a dog or cat by

the infliction of inhumane treatment or gross physical abuse meant to cause said animal the dog or cat intensive or prolonged pain or serious physical injury, or thereby causing the death of the dog or cat due to said the act.

5 "(b) The word "cruel" as used in this article shall 6 mean: Every every act, omission, or neglect, including 7 abandonment, where unnecessary or unjustifiable pain or 8 suffering, including abandonment, is caused or where 9 unnecessary pain or suffering is allowed to continue.

10 "(c) The words "dog or cat" as used in this article 11 shall mean any domesticated member of the dog or cat family.

12 "(d) The word "shelter" as used in this article
13 shall mean a measure by which a dog or cat regularly
14 maintained outdoors is protected from the elements, including
15 heat, cold, wind, and water. The measure shall have a roof,
16 sides, and a floor and be of a size to allow the animal to
17 enter, turn around, and lie down."

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
