23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Sections 9-2-28, 9-2-64, and 9-11-1, Code
25	of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
26	" §9−2−28.

"Whenever the terms "game and fish warden" or "game
and fish wardens" appear in this title, but not including
deputies, such the terms shall mean and refer to conservation
officers appointed by the Commissioner of the Department of
Conservation and Natural Resources.

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"§9-2-64.

"The Commissioner of Conservation and Natural 7 8 Resources shall have power to appoint as many game and fish 9 wardens as he or she shall deem necessary for the proper 10 enforcement of the game and fish laws of the state. All game and fish wardens or deputy wardens shall, before entering upon 11 their duties as such, shall take the oath of office as 12 13 required by law for sheriffs in this state. Before entering upon the duties of their offices, all game and fish wardens or 14 15 deputy wardens shall execute to the State of Alabama a bond, to be approved by the Governor, in the amount of one thousand 16 dollars (\$1,000.00), for the faithful performance of their 17 18 duties. The employees provided for in this section shall be reimbursed for their meals, lodging, and transportation when 19 20 absent from their headquarters in the performance of their 21 duties. Where any area of land or water by purchase, lease or 22 otherwise has been duly organized and developed as a hunting 23 or fishing club, upon recommendation from the officers of such club the Commissioner of Conservation and Natural Resources 24 25 may appoint the superintendent, keeper or other person in 26 charge of the club's grounds and premises, without expense to 27 the state, to the position of deputy game and fish warden.

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"§9-11-1.

"As used in this chapter, the following words and
phrases shall have the following meanings, respectively,
unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

5 "(1) HEREIN, HEREAFTER and HEREOF. Unless otherwise 6 especially restricted or enlarged, such the terms refer to the 7 whole of the conservation laws of this state.

"(3) (2) OFFICER. Such The term includes every 8 9 person authorized to enforce the provisions of the game and 10 fish laws of this state, and whenever the possession, use, importation, transportation, storage, sale, offering, or 11 12 exposing for sale of game birds, animals, or fish is 13 prohibited or restricted, the prohibition or restriction shall 14 extend to and include every part of such the game, bird, 15 animal, or fish, and a violation as to each animal, bird, or fish, or part thereof, shall be a separate offense. 16

17 "(4) (3) THIS CHAPTER or PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER.
18 Such The words shall be taken and construed to include all
19 rules and regulations of the Commissioner of Conservation and
20 Natural Resources passed under and by the authority provided
21 in the game and fish laws of this state.

"(2) (4) WARDEN. The game and fish warden, deputy
 game warden or agent provided for in the game and fish laws of
 this state."

Section 2. Section 9-11-17, Code of Alabama 1975,
which authorizes the Commissioner of the Department of

Conservation and Natural Resources to appoint deputy game and
 fish wardens, is repealed.

3 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 4 first day of the third month following its passage and 5 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
