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8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, a public employee may
9		not be rehired by his or her former public employer
10		for a period of two years after he or she leaves
11		the employment or working arrangement.
12		This bill would allow the Alabama State Law
13		Enforcement Agency to rehire a retired state
14		trooper who was employed by the agency and the
15		Alabama Department of Corrections to rehire a

8 AN ACT

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Relating to the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency and the Alabama Department of Corrections; to allow the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency to rehire retired state troopers who were employed by the agency and the Alabama Department of Corrections to rehire retired state correctional officers who were employed by the department; to provide that the compensation of a rehired retired state trooper or rehired retired correctional officer may not exceed the compensation that he or she received at the time of his or her retirement; to provide that a rehired retired state trooper or rehired retired correctional officer may not accrue additional retirement service credit for any portion of the period of his or her reemployment; and to require that notice of the rehiring be provided to the Employees' Retirement System.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any provision of law, the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency may rehire a retired state trooper who was employed by the agency and the Alabama

Department of Corrections may rehire a retired state

correctional officer who was employed by the department to

perform duties as needed, if:

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- (1) There is a critical personnel shortage such that the rehiring is necessary to provide public safety services.
- (2) The retired state trooper or correctional officer, respectively, has been retired for at least 45 consecutive days prior to reemployment with the agency or department.
- (b) The Director of the Alabama State Law
 Enforcement Agency and or Commissioner of the Alabama
 Department of Corrections shall have the sole discretion to select the retired state trooper or retired correctional officer for reemployment pursuant to the established guidelines for new hires of the agency or the department, respectively.
- (c) The number of retired state troopers or retired correctional officers employed pursuant to this section may not exceed 10 percent of the agency's entire authorized state trooper force or the department's correctional officers force on the effective date of this section.
- (d) The period of reemployment for a retired state trooper or correctional officer pursuant to this section may be no more than a total of 10 years from the date of rehiring by the agency or department.
- (e) The agency may employ retired state troopers at ranks below sergeant only and the department may employ

retired correctional officers at ranks below correctional sergeant only and may not promote the subsequently employed retired state troopers above the rank of sergeant, or retired correctional officers above the rank of correctional sergeant at any time during the subsequent reemployment.

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- (f) The compensation of the rehired retired state trooper or retired correctional officer may not exceed the compensation that he or she received at the time of his or her retirement.
- (g) (1) A rehired retired state trooper or rehired retired correctional officer may continue to receive his or her retirement benefits of whatever kind or description for any period during which he or she is reemployed by the agency or department.
- (2) A rehired retired state trooper or rehired retired correctional officer may not accrue additional retirement service credit for any portion of the period of his or her reemployment.
- (3) The employing authority shall provide written notice of the postretirement employment under this section to the Employees' Retirement System within 30 days after the date the retiree begins performing duties on a full-time or permanent basis.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
