- (b) In the event the Governor declares a state of emergency under Section 31-9-8, employees of entities described in subsection (a) are entitled to employee pay if either of the following occur:
- (1) The state of emergency declaration results in or is otherwise related to the closure of state offices across the state.
- (2) The state of emergency declaration results in or is otherwise related to the closure of state offices in a city or county of the state, and the entity office is located within that city or county.
- (c) Subsection (b) applies to every employee of an affected entity office, regardless of whether he or she lives in the affected area.
- (d) The Department of Mental Health shall adopt rules for the administration of this act.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
