Section 1. (a) For purposes of this section, the term "automated traffic enforcement system" means any camera system that is designed and installed to record violations of traffic safety laws. The term includes, but is not limited to, a system capable of producing at least two recorded images, at least one of which is capable of clearly depicting the license plate of a motor vehicle that is in violation of traffic law. The term also includes, but is not limited to, a system that may work in conjunction with an electrically operated traffic-control device using vehicle sensors synchronized to automatically record, either by conventional film or digital imaging, sequenced photographs or full motion video of the rear of a motor vehicle while proceeding through a signalized intersection, or in conjunction with an electrically operated speed detection device synchronized to automatically record digital imaging of a motor vehicle while speeding.

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- (b) (1) An automated traffic enforcement system may not be used by the state, a county, a municipality, or any other subdivision of the state, to enforce traffic laws.
- (2) All local laws authorizing the use of an automated traffic enforcement system are repealed.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
