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- 2 ENROLLED, An Act,

To establish the Volunteer Rescue Squad Tuition 3 Reimbursement Act of 2018; to require the Alabama Community 4 5 College System, the Alabama Fire College, and the University 6 of South Alabama, in consultation with the Alabama Association of Rescue Squads and the Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire 7 8 Departments, to jointly develop and administer a tuition reimbursement program for students that successfully complete 9 10 an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) certification program; 11 to state that the program shall be funded by direct 12 appropriation from the Education Trust Fund; and to impose 13 requirements for participation in the program including 14 service with a volunteer rescue squad or volunteer fire 15 department located in Alabama for a certain period of time. 16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. For the purposes of this act, thefollowing terms shall have the following meanings:

(1) ACCS. The Alabama Community College System.
 (2) ASSOCIATION. The Alabama Association of Rescue
 Squads.

22 (2) ASSOCIATIONS. The Alabama Association of Rescue
 23 Squads or the Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire
 24 Departments.

1 (3) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL (EMSP). All 2 recognized levels of personnel licensed by the Alabama Department of Public Health, who have met all primary and/or 3 renewal educational requirements set by the Alabama Department 4 5 of Public Health, and are allowed to provide medical care 6 within the level of their scope of practice granted by the Office of Emergency Medical Services (OEMS) within the Alabama 7 Department of Public Health. 8

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(4) FIRE COLLEGE. The Alabama Fire College.

(5) STUDENT. A student enrolled in an emergency
 medical services certification program at a member institution
 of the Alabama Community College System, the Alabama Fire
 College, or the University of South Alabama.

14 (6) VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD. A volunteer rescue squad
15 located in the state of Alabama and is a member of the Alabama
16 Association of Rescue Squads.

17 (7) VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT. A volunteer fire
 18 department located in the state of Alabama and is a member of
 19 the Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire Departments.

20 Section 2. (a) The Alabama Community College System, 21 the Alabama Fire College, and the University of South Alabama, 22 in consultation with the association <u>associations</u>, shall 23 jointly develop and administer a student tuition reimbursement 24 program for students that agree <u>in the form of an enforceable</u> 25 <u>contract agreement</u>, to provide emergency medical services for

volunteer rescue squads <u>or volunteer fire departments</u> in
 Alabama after becoming a licensed EMSP subject to the student
 agreeing to provide 3 years of service to a volunteer rescue
 squad or volunteer fire department.

5 (b) Tuition reimbursement under this act shall be 6 the actual tuition costs paid by the student associated with obtaining certification. Tuition costs shall not be reimbursed 7 8 until the student provides ACCS and the association 9 associations with documentation that he or she has 10 successfully completed the approved course of instruction, 11 proof of passing the certification exam, and production of a 12 valid EMSP license from the Alabama Department of Public 13 Health and a contractual agreement to comply with the service 14 requirements.

15 (c) In the event that a tuition reimbursement 16 recipient fails to meet the service requirements for any 17 reason other than extreme hardship as defined within the joint agreement required in Section 5(b), the individual shall be 18 19 deemed to have breached the underlying contract and shall be 20 liable in the form of monetary damages to the state for the 21 immediate repayment of the total tuition amount reimbursed, 22 plus interest at the rate of 8 percent. The association associations shall notify ACCS of recipients who fail to meet 23 24 the service requirements.

Section 3. Beginning October 1, 2018, the member institutions of the Alabama Community College System, the Alabama Fire College, and the University of South Alabama are authorized to enter into contracts with new students seeking to obtain certification as an EMSP.

6 Section 4. (a) The tuition reimbursement program 7 shall be funded by <u>is subject to</u> direct appropriation 8 <u>appropriations</u> from the Education Trust Fund.

9 (b) Any monies appropriated for the program that are 10 unexpended at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert, but 11 shall be carried forward for use of the program in the next 12 fiscal year.

13 Section 5. (a) The Alabama Community College System 14 shall annually report on the condition and accomplishments of the tuition reimbursement program to the Governor, Speaker of 15 16 the House of Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the 17 Senate, the Chair of the House Ways and Means Education 18 Committee, the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation Education Committee, and the Deputy Director of the Legislative 19 Services Agency-Fiscal Division. The report shall include the 20 21 number of students participating in the program and the amount 22 of tuition reimbursed for the reporting year. The member 23 institutions of the Alabama Community College System, the 24 Alabama Fire College, and the University of South Alabama shall provide this information to ACCS for inclusion in the 25

1 annual report. The report shall also include the usage rate percentage for the preceding fiscal year as calculated by 2 dividing the amount of tuition reimbursed by the amount of 3 4 funds appropriated to the program. If the usage rate 5 percentage for any fiscal year is less than fifty percent 6 (50%), the Alabama Community College System shall make a 7 recommendation in the report to expand the tuition 8 reimbursement program in the subsequent fiscal year to include 9 certification expenditures for volunteer firefighters, subject 10 to continued funding for the program. The report shall be 11 submitted by the fifth legislative day of each regular session 12 of the Legislature.

13 (b) The Alabama Community College System, the 14 Alabama Fire College, and the University of South Alabama shall enter into a joint agreement to implement and administer 15 16 the tuition reimbursement program, which shall include 17 provisions for ensuring that operational expenses for the program in a fiscal year do not exceed 2% of the funding for 18 the program in that fiscal year, such as limiting the 19 20 acceptance of applications fiscal year. The joint agreement 21 shall provide for limiting the acceptance of applications for 22 the program and/or limiting tuition reimbursements when 23 necessary.

(c) Any monies received for the operations of the
 tuition reimbursement program, including repayments, interest

1	and penalties paid because of failure to honor service
2	requirements, shall be used to fund tuition reimbursements.
3	Section 6. This act shall become effective
4	immediately following its passage and approval by the
5	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
