10 TO BE ENTITLED  
11 AN ACT

13 Relating to Fayette County, to amend Section  
14 45-29-110 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for  
15 the compensation of poll workers.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

17 Section 1. Section 45-29-110 of the Code of Alabama  
18 1975, is amended to read as follows:

19 "§45-29-110.

20 "(a) The county commission of Fayette County shall  
21 provide such additional amount of daily compensation as is  
22 necessary to grant each election clerk, inspector, and  
23 returning officer of elections a total compensation of  
24 twenty-five dollars (\$25), and shall increase the mileage  
25 allowance of the returning officer to fifteen cents (\$.15) a  
26 mile in going to the courthouse and returning to the place of  
27 holding the election. Such compensation and mileage shall be

1 paid out of any funds in the county treasury available for  
2 such purposes.

3 "(b) (1) In Fayette County, all inspectors, assistant  
4 inspectors, and technical assistants appointed to conduct  
5 elections at the various polling places are hereby entitled to  
6 an additional per diem allowance in such amount as will,  
7 together with any amount paid by the state, make a total paid  
8 to such officials thirty-five dollars (\$35) for each day they  
9 work at the polls. Such officials, when acting as returning  
10 officers, shall also be entitled to such mileage allowance as  
11 may be prescribed by law.

12 "(2) In Fayette County, all clerks appointed to  
13 conduct elections at the various polling places are hereby  
14 entitled to an additional per diem allowance in such amount as  
15 will, together with any amount paid by the state, make a total  
16 paid to such officials twenty-eight dollars (\$28) for each day  
17 they work at the polls.

18 "(3) If the amount paid to such officials as  
19 compensation or expense allowance by the state increases in  
20 the future, then the amount paid by the county under this  
21 subsection shall automatically decrease in a like amount.

22 "(4) The expense allowances provided for in this  
23 subsection shall be paid from the general fund of the county.

24 "(c) In addition to the compensation provided in  
25 subsections (a) and (b), the county commission shall provide  
26 to each poll worker who works at a polling place in the  
27 county, together with any amount paid by the state pursuant to

1 general law, an amount of compensation to make the total  
2 compensation of each poll worker a minimum of one hundred  
3 dollars (\$100) for each day the poll worker works at the polls  
4 during an election."

5           Section 2. This act shall become effective on the  
6 first day of the third month following its passage and  
7 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
