13	Relating to the City of Birmingham in Jefferson
14	County; to require the City of Birmingham to establish by

18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. This act shall only apply in the City of
20	Birmingham.
21	Section 2. For the purposes of this act, the
22	following words shall have the following meanings:
23	(1) CITY. The City of Birmingham.
24	(2) VACANT BUILDING. A building or other structure
25	that is unoccupied or unsecured and occupied by one or more
26	unauthorized persons for an amount of time as determined by
27	the ordinance. The term does not include a new building under

construction or a building that by definition is exempted by an ordinance of the county or municipality.

Section 3. The Birmingham City Council, by ordinance, shall establish a vacant building registration program and, on a case by case basis upon request by the property owner, may exempt a vacant building from registration upon a finding of good cause shown that the property owner is unable to occupy the building for a determinant period of time.

Section 4. (a) An owner of real property subject to registration may be charged a fee as provided by the ordinance. The ordinance shall provide procedures for the administration and enforcement of registration and payment and collection of registration fees.

- (b) The ordinance may require the owner of the vacant building who resides outside of the state to provide the name and address of a person who resides within the state who is authorized to accept service of process and notices of fees due under this section on behalf of the owner and who is designated as a responsible local party or agent for the purposes of notification in the event of an emergency affecting the public health, safety, or welfare.
- (c) The ordinance may authorize the city to institute a civil action against the property owner or file a lien on real property for unpaid or delinquent vacant building registration fees, or both. Before any lien is filed, the Birmingham City Council shall give notice to the property

owner or owner's agent, by certified mail, return receipt requested, that the county commission will file the lien unless the delinquent fees are paid by a date stated in the notice, which date shall be no less than 30 days from the date the notice is received by the owner or the owner's agent, as shown on the signed certified mail return receipt. The ordinance may provide for alternative means of service when service cannot be obtained by certified mail.

- (d) The ordinance shall permit a property owner to challenge any determination made pursuant to the ordinance. The administrative procedures adopted pursuant to the ordinance shall include the right to appeal to the Jefferson County Circuit Court.
- (f) The Birmingham City Council shall deposit the proceeds from the fee into a separate account, which shall be used for any of the following:
- (1) Improving public safety efforts, especially for law enforcement and fire personnel, who most often contend with the dangerous situations manifested in vacant properties.
 - (2) Monitoring and administering this act.
- (3) Repairing, closing, or demolishing a vacant structure as authorized by this act.

Section 5. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
