23	Section 2. Effective beginning the next term of
24	office of the coroner in January 2019, the coroner may appoin
25	a qualified person to serve as deputy coroner to perform the
26	duties of the coroner when the coroner is unavailable or

absent or when the coroner is incapacitated. When called upon

to serve, the deputy coroner shall have the same legal 1 2 authority and responsibility as the coroner. The annual salary of the deputy coroner shall be six thousand dollars (\$6,000) 3 per year payable from the general fund of the county. 4 5 Section 3.
