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11	WHEREAS, endometriosis is a disease of the female
12	reproductive system; and
13	WHEREAS, endometriosis occurs when tissue similar to
14	that normally found in the uterus begins to grow outside of
15	the uterus, leading to chronic, debilitating pelvic pain; and
16	WHEREAS, endometriosis is a leading cause of female
17	infertility; and
18	WHEREAS, endometriosis affects 1 in 10 women of
19	childbearing age in the United States; and
20	WHEREAS, there is an average of a 10-year delay from
21	the onset of symptoms to the final diagnosis of endometriosis;
22	and
23	WHEREAS, U. S. endometriosis patients were
24	hospitalized 105,123 days in 2010 because of their disease;
25	and

WHEREAS, women with endometriosis can lose 11 hours 1 2 per work week through lost productivity and absenteeism due to 3 pain; and WHEREAS, Fifty-one percent of endometriosis patients 4 5 report that their disease detrimentally affects their job; and WHEREAS, the estimated total annual societal burden 6 of endometriosis-related symptoms in the U. S is \$56 billion 7 8 or \$10,824 per patient; and 9 WHEREAS, there is no cure for endometriosis; and 10 WHEREAS, more research is necessary to develop treatment options to manage this debilitating disease; and 11 WHEREAS, traditionally, providers have focused on 12 13 managing the associated pain with oral contraceptives, 14 progestins, danazol, nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs 15 (NSAIDs), opioids, and GnRH agonists, many of which are not specifically indicated for the treatment of endometriosis; in 16 17 more extensive cases, surgical interventions (e.g. laparotomy 18 or laparoscopy) are often pursued and may not be curative for all individuals; and 19 20 WHEREAS, more research is needed to find additional 21 treatment options to manage this debilitating disease; and 22 WHEREAS, education is important for promoting 23 awareness of symptoms and early detection and diagnosis of 24 endometriosis; now therefore, 25 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the we recognize the month of 26 27 March as Endometriosis Awareness Month and encourage the state

- to observe the month with related awareness and educational
  campaigns.
