stockings and brogans; her favorite subjects were math, 1 2 spelling, and reading; many years later, she obtained her GED; she took 32 lessons in Nursing and received her certificate, 3 and she attended evening classes at Bishop State Community 5 College, where she majored in Elementary Education; and 6 WHEREAS, Mrs. Mitchell met her husband, Arthella, 7 during a revival at True Light Baptist Church in September 8 1935, and the couple was united in Holy matrimony in Koenton, Alabama, by Reverend A.D.
