WHEREAS, in September 1946, Bernice married George Harper Stacy, whom she had known all her life; he had returned in February 1946 after serving three years in the Army in Europe during the war; they were loved by their community and were well-known for their fun dinner parties; they had hunting dogs and enjoyed hunting and fishing and taking care of the dogs; she could make a gourmet meal out of anything he brought home from the hunt; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Stacy was a beloved teacher and librarian at Bibb County Junior High and High Schools, where she taught eighth grade science and served as librarian for 34 years; she also worked at the board of education; her legacy to her students was to "be the best you can be"; her mission as a teacher was to encourage and instruct those who needed extra attention to put them on the right track to be successful; and
