BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we recognize the establishment of a state firefighter cancer registry database created by the Alabama Fire College that will provide a tool for all firefighters in the state, whether paid or volunteer, to login and enter their exposure information.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this database will provide a private account that only the firefighter or an administrator of the database system can access for privacy concerns.

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, We acknowledge that the 12 exposure information, less any personal information not 13 required, would be collected from the entries in the database 14 and forwarded annually to the Centers for Disease Control and 15 Prevention to be utilized in studies that are attempting to 16 limit the exposure of firefighters to known carcinogens while 17 performing the duties of their job.
