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Existing law provides for the Mowa Band of 8 SYNOPSIS: Choctaw Indians to employ police officers and 9 10 limits the exercise of their powers to the premises 11 of the reservation except when in appropriate 12 pursuit off the premises of the reservation of an 13 offender who is charged with a crime while on the 14 premises of the reservation, when making a lawful 15 arrest for a felony committed, or probable cause to 16 believe a felony has been committed, in the 17 presence of the police officer, or within the 18 boundaries of property owned or operated by the tribe. 19

This bill would give the Poarch Band of Creek Indians the same powers and authority to employ police officers for the protection of the reservation and the safety of the tribe.

15 "The Mowa Band of Choctaw Indians Tribal Council 16 tribal council of a tribe may appoint and employ one or more 17 suitable persons to act as police officers to protect the 18 reservation of the tribe from intruders and trespassers, to 19 prevent damage to the properties and grounds of the 20 reservation of the tribe, and to provide for the safety of 21 residents and employees of the reservation of the tribe. No 22 state or local funds allocated for law enforcement purposes 23 shall be used to provide financial support for the law 24 enforcement officers hired by the Mowa Band of Choctaw Indians 25 a tribe. "Any police officer appointed <u>by a tribe</u> pursuant to
Section 36-21-122 shall be charged with all the powers of
state or municipal police officers including, but not limited

"(2) Without a warrant, arrest a person who is 9 10 engaging in disorderly conduct, trespassing upon the property of the reservation, or committing any public offense in the 11 presence of the police officers on the reservation property, 12 13 and carry the person before the proper court and, upon proper 14 affidavit, charge the person with committing the offense and 15 the person so arrested may be tried and convicted as in cases of persons brought before the a court on the warrant of the 16 17 court.

"(3) Arrest any person pursuant to a warrant who is
on the premises of the reservation and is charged with any
public offense and take the person before the proper office.

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"§36-21-124.

"The powers of police officers appointed <u>by a tribe</u> pursuant to this article may be exercised only upon the premises of the reservation <u>of the tribe</u>, and a police officer shall <u>may</u> not otherwise act as a police officer while off the premises of the <u>his or her</u> reservation, except under either of the following conditions: 1 "(1) When in appropriate pursuit off the reservation 2 of any offender or suspected offender who is charged with the 3 commission of a crime while on the premises of the 4 reservation.

5 "(2) To make lawful arrests for a felony committed, 6 or for which there is probable cause to believe has been 7 committed, in the presence of the police officer or within the 8 boundaries of the property owned or operated by the 9 reservation tribe."

10 Section 2. This act shall become effective 11 immediately following its passage and approval by the 12 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
