8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the Department of
9 Corrections is authorized to purchase equipment,
10 raw materials, and supplies necessary for the
11 manufacture or production of prison-made goods.

12 This bill would provide that the Department
13 of Corrections is authorized to make such a
14 purchase without going through state purchasing.

20 To amend Section 14-7-8, Code of Alabama 1975,
21 relating to purchases by the Department of Corrections for the
22 manufacture or production of prison-made goods; to exempt the
23 Department of Corrections from the purchasing through the
24 Division of Purchasing of the Department of Finance.

25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

26 Section 1. Section 14-7-8, Code of Alabama 1975, is
27 amended to read as follows:

1 "§14-7-8.

2 "(a) The Alabama ~~Board~~ Department of Corrections is
3 authorized to purchase in the manner prescribed by law,
4 equipment, raw materials, components, and supplies and to
5 engage the supervisory personnel necessary to establish and
6 maintain for this state at ~~the~~ a penitentiary or ~~any~~ a penal
7 farm or institution now or hereafter under the control of said
8 board industries for the utilization of services of prisoners
9 in the manufacture or production of such articles or products
10 as may be needed for the construction, operation, maintenance
11 or use of any office, department, institution or agency
12 supported in whole or in part by this state and the political
13 subdivisions thereof.

14 "(b) Purchases of equipment, raw materials,
15 components, and supplies by the Alabama Department of
16 Corrections for the manufacture or production of prison-made
17 goods pursuant to subsection (a) are exempt from purchasing
18 through the Division of Purchasing of the Department of
19 Finance."

20 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
21 first day of the third month following its passage and
22 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
