In addition, cranes, derricks, power 13 shovels, and similar equipment are required to have 14 a warning sign posted on the equipment concerning 15 the operation within six feet of overhead high 16 voltage lines. Both laws are subject to criminal 17 penalties. This bill would increase the distance under 18 both laws to 10 feet. 19 20 Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama 21 of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the 22 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 23 Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general 24 law whose purpose or effect would be to require a 25 new or increased expenditure of local funds from 26 becoming effective with regard to a local 27 governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote

unless: it comes within one of a number of 1 2 specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates 3 funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to 4 5 the entity for the purpose. The purpose or effect of this bill would be 6 7 to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, 8 9 the bill does not require approval of a local 10 governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the 11 12 specified exceptions contained in the amendment. 13 A BILL 14 15 TO BE ENTITLED 16 AN ACT 17 To amend Sections 37-8-52 and 37-8-53 of the Code of 18 Alabama 1975, prohibiting the operation of certain equipment 19 20 within a certain distance from high voltage overhead 21 conductors of electricity and requiring the posting of warning signs on certain equipment concerning the operation of certain 22 equipment near overhead high voltage electric lines and 23 24 providing criminal penalties; to increase the distance where 25 operation of the equipment is prohibited and to revise the 26 warning signs required on equipment accordingly; and in 27 connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the

requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 37-8-52 and 37-8-53 of the Code
of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

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"§37-8-52.

10 "(a) No person shall either personally or through an 11 employee or agent, or as an employee or agent of another, use, 12 operate, place, erect, or move any tools, machinery, 13 equipment, apparatus, or material, or move any building or 14 other structure or any part thereof within six 10 feet of a 15 high voltage overhead conductor of electricity except where 16 such the person has arranged effectively to safeguard against 17 danger of accidental contact with such the high voltage 18 overhead conductor of electricity by either any of the

19 <u>following</u>:

20 "(1) The erection of mechanical barriers which shall 21 prevent physical contact with such the high voltage overhead 22 conductor $\tau$ .

"(2) Deenergizing such the high voltage overhead
 conductor and grounding the same; or.

25 "(3) Temporary or permanent relocation of such the
26 high voltage overhead conductor.

"(b) Only in the case of compliance with one or more 1 2 of the above safety measures, after the negotiation of 3 mutually agreeable arrangements with the owner or operator of such the high voltage overhead conductor, may the six-foot 4 5 10-foot clearance requirement be reduced. In no event shall 6 the provisions of this section be construed to permit any 7 contact being made with high voltage overhead conductors and 8 their supports, whether energized or not. The required 9 six-foot 10-foot clearance shall not be provided by impressing 10 strains, by attachment or otherwise, upon the conductors or their supporting structures or upon their appurtenances or 11 associated equipment. 12

"(c) Each person who fails to comply with or who violates the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500.00 five hundred dollars (\$500) or imprisonment not exceeding 12 months, or both.

18 "(d) For the purposes of this section, the following 19 terms shall have the following meanings:

20 "(1) HIGH VOLTAGE. A voltage in excess of 750 volts, 21 measured between conductors or measured between the conductor 22 and the ground.

"(2) OVERHEAD CONDUCTOR. Any electrical conductor,
 (either bare or covered), installed above the ground, except
 such conductors as that are enclosed in iron pipe or other
 metal covering of equal strength.

27 "§37-8-53.

1 "Whoever operates or employs any person to operate 2 any crane, derrick, power shovel, drilling rig, pile driver, 3 or like apparatus, any part of which is capable of vertical, lateral, or swinging motion, without there being posted and 4 5 maintained in plain view of the operator thereof a durable, 6 weather-resistant warning sign legible at 12 feet, reading 7 "WARNING, unlawful to operate this equipment within six 10 feet of overhead high voltage lines," is guilty of a 8 9 misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than 10 \$500.00 five hundred dollars (\$500) and imprisoned for not more than 12 months, or both fined and imprisoned. Each day's 11 failure to post or maintain such a sign shall constitute a 12 13 separate offense."

14 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its 15 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further 16 17 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now 18 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the 19 20 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an 21 existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective January1, 2019.

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
