24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited
2.6	as the Alabama Entrepreneurial Veteran Soldier Act.

Section 2. (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

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- (1) VETERAN. A person who has served in the active military, naval, or air service, or who has served on continuous federalized active duty for 180 days or for the total period for which the person was ordered to active military duty, other than for purposes of active duty for training, and who was discharged or released therefrom under conditions other than dishonorable.
 - (2) VETERAN-OWNED BUSINESS. Any business entity or organization whether for profit or non-profit, that is no less than 51 percent owned and controlled by a veteran who is a resident of this state at the time of formation of the entity or organization.
 - (b) The Secretary of State and Attorney General shall waive all filing fees and other associated fees for the formation and registration of any domestic business entity or organization that is a veteran-owned business.
 - (c) Any fee for an occupational license collected by any county or municipality shall be waived for the owner or organizer of any veteran-owned business, for profit or non-profit, if the occupational license is required to operate the business. This subsection may not be construed as providing a fee exemption for a professional license issued by this state.
 - (d) The fee waivers provided under subsections (b) and (c) shall apply to a veteran-owned business if the

business or organization was established or has an initial start-up date on or after January 1, 2019. The waivers shall only apply for a maximum period of two years after the initial establishment, formation, or start-up date of the veteran-owned business as determined by the date on which the business is formed or registered in accordance with state law in the Office of the Secretary of State or Office of the Attorney General.

- (e) Any veteran applying for a business formation or registration fee waiver or a fee waiver for an occupational license required to operate a veteran-owned business shall provide the state agency, department, county, municipality, or other licensing authority with any of the following as proof of his or her veteran status prior to eligibility for any exemptions under this section:
 - (1) A copy of a valid Federal DD-214 form.
- (2) A valid Veterans Health Identification Card issued by the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- (3) A current state issued driver's identification card with veteran's designation.
- (f) The Secretary of State and the Attorney General shall adopt rules establishing antifraud provisions to deter and penalize any business or organization that is not majority owned or controlled by a veteran or veterans but by a person or persons who falsely claim to be a veteran in order to receive the waiver of fees under subsections (b) and (c).

(g) The Offices of the Secretary of State and the Attorney General shall provide notice of the establishment of the Alabama Entrepreneurial Veteran Soldier Act and its provisions by, at a minimum, providing information via the agency's website describing the provisions of this section in order to assist veterans with applying for waivers provided under this section.

(h) No later than January 2, 2020, and every year annually thereafter, the Offices of the Secretary of State and Attorney General and any county or municipality providing a fee waiver under subsections (b) and (c) shall submit an annual year-end report to the Chair of the House Ways and Means Committee and to the Chair of the Senate Fiscal Responsibility and Economic Development Committee regarding the utilization of the veteran-owned business waivers established under this section. The report shall include at a minimum, the total amount for all exemptions provided and the total number of business and occupational license fee exemptions applied for and issued to new veteran-owned businesses and owners during the previous year.

Section 3. This act shall become effective January 1, 2019, following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
