8 WHEREAS, pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric 9 syndrome (PANS) and pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric 10 disorder associated with streptococal infection (PANDAS) 11 create the sudden onset of obsessive-compulsive disorder in 12 children, causing previously health and emotionally adjusted 13 children to experience severe anxiety and emotional 14 disturbances; and

15 WHEREAS, children with PANS and PANDAS tend to 16 manifest some of the following symptoms: tics or other 17 abnormal movements, severe separation anxiety, generalized 18 anxiety, irritability, aggression, personalty changes, 19 attention deficit hyperactive disorder, marked deterioration 20 in learning and school performance, and developmental 21 regression, including regression in handwriting; and

22 WHEREAS, children with PANS and PANDAS may 23 experience a moderate to dramatic improvement with 24 antibiotics, intravenous immunoglobulin (IVIG) treatment, or 25 plasmapheresis; and 1 WHEREAS, researchers at the National Institute of 2 Mental Health (NIMH) are currently engaged in extensive 3 research and testing on how to effectively treat PANS and 4 PANDAS; and

5 WHEREAS, researchers at Moleculera Labs at the 6 University of Oklahoma have developed PANS and PANDAS blood 7 testing procedures; and

8 WHEREAS, the University of Arizona and Banner Health 9 System in Arizona have opened the first Centers for 10 Post-Infectious Autoimmune Encephalopathy, providing 11 insurance-based access to expert care and consultative 12 services for general and subspecialist pediatricians around 13 the country; and

14 WHEREAS, the medical and bioscience resources in 15 Alabama make our state well situated to meaningfully 16 contribute to best medical practices, research, and medical 17 technology to advance the early diagnosis and treatment of 18 children with PANS and PANDAS; and

WHEREAS, the NIMH estimates one in 200 children have
PANS or PANDAS, meaning these diseases affect roughly 15,000
children in Alabama; and

22 WHEREAS, many general pediatricians, nurse 23 practitioners, and pediatric subspecialists are not familiar 24 with the most current diagnostic criteria and treatment 25 guidelines for these disorders; and

1 WHEREAS, in addition to lack of access to treatment 2 providers, many insurers do not cover treatment for PANS and 3 PANDAS, which can cost many tens of thousands of dollars, 4 placing it out of reach for most families; and

5 WHEREAS, the Southeastern PANS/PANDAS Association 6 (SEPPA) is a Georgia-based nonprofit organization dedicated to 7 expanding access to expert, insurance-based care for children 8 and families suffering from PANS and PANDAS in this region; 9 and

10 WHEREAS, it is imperative that there be greater 11 public awareness of this serious health issue among parents, 12 policy makers, and medical providers in Alabama; now 13 therefore,

14 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 15 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we recognize October 9, 2018, 16 as PANDA Awareness Day in Alabama.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the public and the press.
