11	thereby may appeal such the ruling to the circuit court of the
12	county where the party aggrieved resides board maintains its
13	<u>headquarters</u> . The notice of appeal shall be filed within 30
14	days from the receipt of such the order or ruling. Appeals
15	shall otherwise be governed by the judicial review provisions
16	of the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act."
