8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
9	Section 1. Section 26-16-70, Code of Alabama 1975,
10	is amended to read as follows:
11	<b>"</b> §26-16-70.
12	"(a) For purposes of this section, the following
13	terms have the following meanings:
14	"(1) FORENSIC INTERVIEW. The same meaning as in
15	<u>Section 12-15-301.</u>
16	"(2) LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES. The police
17	department for the municipality and the sheriff's department
18	for the county in which a child advocacy center is located.
19	"(3) MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL. An individual
20	holding a master's or higher degree in social work, mental
21	health counseling, or other social work related or mental
22	health counseling related field of study, and who has received
23	special training regarding child maltreatment and child
24	trauma.

1	"(b) In order to become eligible for a full
2	membership in the Alabama Network of Children's Advocacy
3	Centers, Incorporated, child advocacy centers in this state
4	shall:

- "(1) Be a private, non-profit incorporated

  Incorporate as a nonprofit agency under the requirements of

  Section 10A-3-1.01 et seq.
- "(2) Have <u>Utilize</u> a neutral, child-focused facility where <u>joint Department of Human Resources and law enforcement forensic interviews, conducted jointly by the Department of <u>Human Resources and law enforcement personnel</u>, take place with children in appropriate cases of suspected child sexual and physical abuse. All multidisciplinary agencies shall <u>have utilize</u> a <u>place facility</u> to interact with the child as investigative or treatment needs require.</u>
- "(3) Have a minimum Employ or utilize designated staff that is supervised and approved by operate under the supervision and approval of the local board of directors of the child advocacy center.
- "(4) Having Maintain a multidisciplinary case review team that meets on a regularly scheduled basis or as the case load of the community requires to coordinate the multidisciplinary response to child abuse. The At a minimum, the team shall consist of representatives from the district attorney, the Department of Human Resources, mental health,

2	personnel and a victim's advocate may be part of the team. the
3	<pre>following:</pre>
4	"a. The local district attorney, or his or her
5	designee or designees.
6	"b. One or more representatives from the Department

10	enforcement agency.
11	"e. The staff of the child advocacy center.
12	"(5) Provide case tracking of child abuse cases seen
13	worked through the center. A center shall also and, at a
14	minimum, collect demographic data on: The number of child
15	abuse cases seen at the center by sex, race, age, and other
16	relevant data; the number of cases referred for prosecution;
17	and the number of cases referred for mental health therapy
18	regarding all children referred to the center for services as
19	well as any other data required by the Alabama Network of
20	Child Advocacy Centers.
21	"(6) <del>Provide referrals for</del> <u>Offer on-site</u> medical
22	exams and mental health therapy or provide referrals for
23	off-site medical exams and mental health therapy. The center
24	shall provide follow-up on cases referred for mental health
25	therapy.

Τ	"(/) Provide training for <del>various disciplines</del>
2	multidisciplinary team members in the community that deal with
3	respond to cases of possible child abuse.
4	"(8) Have Participate in an interagency commitment
5	agreement covering those aspects of agency participation in a
6	multidisciplinary approach to the handling of child sexual and
7	serious physical abuse cases. The agreement must be signed by
8	the following:
9	"a. The local district attorney, or his or her
10	designee.
11	"b. A designee of the Department of Human Resources.
12	"c. A designee of a local law enforcement agency.
13	"d. The director of the child advocacy center.
14	"(9) Provide assurance that <u>staff and</u> volunteers at
15	the center are trained and screened by appropriate resources
16	as specified by the Alabama Network of Children's Advocacy
17	<pre>Centers."</pre>
18	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
19	first day of the third month following its passage and
20	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law, and
21	is contingent upon the passage of HB of the 2019 Regular
22	Session, relating to statements made by children during
23	forensic interviews.
