Section 9-11-244 of the Code of Alabama 14 1975, is amended to read as follows: 15 "§9-11-244. 16 "(a) No Except as provided in subsection (b), no 17 person at any time shall take, catch, kill, or attempt to 18 take, catch, or kill any bird or animal protected by law or 19 regulation <u>rule</u> of the State of Alabama by means, aid, or use, 20 directly or indirectly, of any bait, such as shelled, shucked, 21 or unshucked corn or of wheat or other grain, salt, or any 22 other feed whatsoever that has been so deposited, placed, 23 distributed, or scattered as to constitute for such the birds 24 or animals a lure, attraction, or enticement to, on, or over the area where such a hunter or hunters are attempting to kill 25

1 or take them; provided, that such the birds or animals may be 2 taken under properly shocked corn and standing crops of corn, 3 wheat $_{L}$ or other grain or feed and grains scattered solely as a 4 result of normal agricultural harvesting; and provided 5 further, migratory birds may be hunted under the most recent 6 provisions regulations established by the U.S. Fish and 7 Wildlife Service or regulations rules promulgated adopted by 8 the Commissioner of the Department of Conservation and Natural 9 Resources within the limits of the federal regulations. 10 "(b)(1) This section shall not apply to a person 11 hunting whitetail deer or feral swine with the aid of bait on 12 privately owned or leased lands; provided, that the person has 13 purchased, and is in possession of, a bait privilege license 14 issued by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources as follows: 15 16 "a. The annual resident bait privilege license fee shall be fourteen dollars (\$14), plus an issuance fee of one 17 18 dollar (\$1). "b. The annual nonresident bait privilege license 19 fee shall be fifty dollars (\$50), plus an issuance fee of one 20 dollar (\$1). 21 "(2) The fees provided for by this section shall be 22 23 subject to adjustment as provided in Section 9-11-68. 24 "(3) A bait privilege license required by this section shall be procured in the same manner as an annual 25

3	"(4) A person who is exempt from purchasing a
4	hunting license shall not be exempt from the requirement to

6	"(c) The commissioner may, without refund, suspend
7	the use of a baiting privilege license and adopt rules to
8	manage the feeding of wild game animal populations on a
9	county, regional, or statewide basis to prevent the spread of
10	diseases among wildlife by announcing the suspension in a news
11	release.
12	"(d) The Department of Conservation and Natural
13	Resources may adopt rules to implement the act adding this
14	amendatory language."
15	Section 2. This act shall become effective
16	immediately following its passage and approval by the
17	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
