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8	Relating to the Permanent Joint Transportation
9	Committee; to amend Sections 29-2-1, 29-2-2, 29-2-3, 29-2-4,
10	29-2-6, and 29-2-8, Code of Alabama 1975; to provide for
11	technical corrections concerning the duties of the committee
12	as it relates to the Alabama Department of Transportation
13	long-range plan; to increase the number of members of the
14	Committee and specify their residency requirements; to provide
15	clarification of the long-range plan; and to provide
16	clarification of the Alabama Department of Transportation's
17	duties and information requirements to the Committee relating
18	to the long-range plan.
19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. Sections 29-2-1, 29-2-2, 29-2-3, 29-2-4,
21	29-2-6, and 29-2-8, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read
22	as follows:
23	"§29-2-1.
24	"The Legislature hereby finds and declares as
25	follows: A long-range program of highway development and
26	<u>maintenance</u> in Alabama (herein <del>called</del> "the state") is vital to
27	the <u>safety of the traveling public as well as the</u> industrial

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1 and agricultural growth and to the present and future 2 well-being of the citizens of the state; the highway system in the state must be adequate to meet such expanding needs; the 3 highway construction, modification, maintenance, and 4 5 administration to support such a system must should include long-range planning, soundness in scope of the highway 6 7 program, efficient performance, and fiscal responsibility in both policy and planning; the use enactment of a long-range 8 highway program will further the judicious expenditure of 9 10 highway funds, will promote the public safety and convenience and public safety, will enhance public confidence in the 11 responsible expenditure of public funds, and will result in 12 13 tangible benefits to the public by providing a sound program 14 to facilitate vehicular traffic and safety; such a long-range 15 program will establish continuity in highway construction, modification, and maintenance programs, thereby enabling the 16 17 State of Alabama Department of Transportation (herein called 18 "ALDOT" or "the Transportation Department") to operate at maximum efficiency with a greater returns in highway benefits 19 20 for the amount of public funds expended; all citizens and 21 interested parties should be aware of how their highway 22 dollars funds will be expended well as far in advance of such 23 the actual expenditures as possible; , and because changing of 24 routes affect people's travel times and patterns as well as 25 property values, all plans for such changes should be 26 transparent and made known to all citizens simultaneously well 27 in advance of their implementation; such a long-range program

1	requires advance consideration of priority of highway
2	construction and modification projects and of adequate budgets
3	for highway construction, modification, maintenance, and
4	administration achieving an appropriate balance in highway
5	decision making is an important goal; and, to the foregoing
6	ends, it is desirable to create a permanent joint
7	transportation committee of the Legislature which will develop
8	expertise pertaining to highway matters within both
9	legislative bodies and which will insure geographical balance
10	in highway decision making the development of highway plans
11	and budgets for their implementation is a primary
12	responsibility of the Transportation Department working under
13	the direction of the Governor; appropriate legislative
14	oversight procedures are necessary to fulfill the goals set
15	forth above; a Joint Transportation Committee of the
16	Legislature will develop expertise pertaining to highway
17	matters within both legislative bodies and will contribute
18	actively to the Legislature's deliberations with respect to
19	highway funding and plans; and now therefore, the creation of
20	such Joint Transportation Committee is appropriate and
21	desirable.
22	This article shall be liberally construed in order
23	to effect the purposes.
24	"§29-2-2.
25	" <u>(a)</u> There is hereby created a continuing permanent
26	joint transportation committee of the Legislature to be known
27	as the "Joint Transportation Committee." The committee shall

1 consist of seven twelve members of the Senate appointed by the 2 President of the Senate and seven twelve members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of 3 Representatives, one senator and one house member to be a 4 5 resident of each present United States congressional district in the state and one senator and one house member to be a 6 7 resident of each Alabama Department of Transportation region. Of the total membership, a minimum of two members shall be 8 9 from the Minority party.

10 "(b) The members that reside in the Alabama Department of Transportation regions Members of the Joint 11 12 Transportation Committee shall be appointed within thirty days 13 of the effective date of this act; in subsequent years, 14 members of the Joint Transportation Committee shall be 15 appointed within five legislative days after the convening of 16 the first regular session after the election of each 17 Legislature. Members shall hold office during their terms as 18 legislators and until their successors are appointed. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the respective 19 20 presiding officer. Appointees shall be residents of the 21 congressional district where the vacancy exists made to 22 fulfill the residency requirements outlined above. "(c) The appointing authorities shall coordinate 23 24 their appointments to assure the committee membership is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, 25 26 rural, and economic diversity of the state. 27 "§29-2-3.

1	"Within 10 days after members of the Joint
2	Transportation Committee are appointed as provided in this
3	article, the committee shall convene at a place and time
4	designated by the President of the Senate in written notice
5	given to each member at least five days in advance or without
6	notice upon unanimous consent of the members of the Joint
7	Transportation Committee The Joint Transportation Committee
8	shall meet the fourth Wednesday of January, April, July, and
9	October at 1:30 PM at the Alabama State House. At the second
10	<u>quarterly</u> meeting <u>of each year</u> , and at the initial meeting
11	during each session of the Legislature, the Joint
12	Transportation Committee shall elect from its membership a
13	chair and vice-chair which shall rotate between members from
14	the House and Senate. Special meetings of the Joint
15	Transportation Committee may be called by the chair by giving
16	members of the committee 14 days notice when the Legislature
17	is out of session, and 24 hours notice if a meeting is called
18	on a legislative day or legislative committee day. Special
19	meetings may also be called by petition of a majority of the
20	members of the committee that includes the date and time of
21	the meeting and all members are given 24 hours notice. The
22	Joint Transportation Committee shall meet, at the request of
23	its chair or as its members shall determine, in both cases
24	upon written notice at least five days in advance or without
25	notice upon unanimous consent of its membership; provided,
26	that the committee shall meet at least once each three months.
27	Decisions of the Joint Transportation Committee may be made by

a majority of the members present and voting at any properly 1 2 convened meeting as long as a quorum is in attendance. A quorum shall consist of any eight thirteen members. If less 3 than a quorum is present at any meeting the recommendations 4 5 presented by ALDOT shall be deemed approved. or any adjournment thereof, those members who are present may adjourn 6 7 the meeting from time to time and a majority vote of the 8 members present shall be sufficient, without any notice other 9 than by announcement at the meeting, to adjourn the meeting 10 from time to time until a quorum is in attendance. At any 11 adjourned meeting, any business may be transacted that might 12 have been transacted at the meeting as originally called 13 Should any member be absent from two meetings of the four 14 quarterly meetings during any calendar year, they shall be 15 deemed to have forfeited their position and a replacement shall be appointed by the respective appointing authority as 16 outlined herein. Upon the request of the Chair, the Secretary 17 18 of the Senate and the Clerk of the House shall provide clerical assistance as the committee requires. 19 20 "§29-2-4. 21 "The powers and duties of the Joint Transportation 22 Committee shall be the following as follows: 23 "(1) It shall review and concur in a and shall 24 consider concurring with the long-range plan of the 25 Transportation Department as such plan exists at the date of 26 the meeting called for the purpose of reviewing the plan. The "long-range plan" referred to herein is the Statewide 27

1	Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) maintained by ALDOT
2	for the purpose of complying with requirements of the Federal
3	Highway Administration, which plan is amended multiple times
4	each year for administrative as well as substantive reasons,
5	and which plan shall be constantly available on the ALDOT
6	website. A member of the Committee may propose an amendment to
7	the STIP provided that the proposed amendment is delivered in
8	writing to the Transportation Department by the close of
9	business of the fourth Wednesday after the draft plan is
10	presented to the Committee. The proposed amendment shall be
11	fiscally constrained within the funding category shown in the
12	draft STIP. The Department shall prepare the amendment and
13	deliver to each member of the Committee no later than the
14	fourth Wednesday of the month prior to the next quarterly
15	meeting. Should the Committee, by majority vote, accept the
16	proposed amendment, the amendment shall be delivered by the
17	Chair of the Committee to the Governor for consideration of
18	changing the STIP as presented by the Transportation
19	<u>Department.(five-year) federal-aid highway plan for proposed</u>
20	highway construction of all highways on the state highway
21	system, which long-range plan shall commence with the fiscal
22	year of the state beginning October 1, 1989. Prior to any
23	deviation from the intent of the five-year plan, the Joint
24	Transportation Committee shall review and concur in the
25	deviation, except commitments for highway projects necessary
26	for new or expanded industry. Commitments for these industry
27	projects shall be included in the next quarterly report by the

Department of Transportation. The plan shall be updated annually. The plans in appropriate form shall be made available to all government agencies and all members of the public and news media.

5 "(2) The update of the Transportation Department's annual fund allocation plan shall be presented to the Joint 6 7 Transportation Committee at the third quarterly meeting of 8 each year. The review and consideration of concurrence in the 9 annual update of the five-year highway plan shall be 10 accomplished by the Joint Transportation Committee prior to September 1 no later than the last quarterly meeting of each 11 year. Failure of the Joint Transportation Committee to concur 12 13 in the annual update will not prevent the Department of 14 Transportation Department from proceeding with any project.

15 "(3) The Transportation Department's requested budget for the following fiscal year shall be presented to the 16 17 Joint Transportation Committee at the last quarterly meeting 18 of the year. It shall review the budget for highway 19 construction, maintenance, operation, and administration of 20 the Department of Transportation proposed by the 21 Transportation Department on an annual basis, which budget review shall be reviewed completed not later than the 22 23 fifteenth legislative day of each annual session of the 24 Legislature first quarterly meeting of each year. The Joint 25 Transportation Committee shall report on the budget requests 26 of the Transportation Department to the House Ways and Means 27 General Fund Committee and the Senate Finance and Taxation

<u>General Fund Committee and may make recommendations about the</u>
 budget to the committees.

"(4) An in-progress draft of the Annual Report 3 outlined in Section 23-1-35, Code of Alabama 1975 shall be 4 5 presented to the Joint Transportation Committee at the first quarterly meeting of each year. All comments and input from 6 7 members of the Joint Transportation Committee shall be 8 delivered to the Transportation Department within 30 days of 9 the first quarterly meeting to allow consideration by the 10 Transportation Department prior to publishing.

"(5) The Transportation Department shall prepare and 11 12 submit for review by the Joint Transportation Committee a 13 long-range plan for the Department at the first quarterly meeting of the year. The plan shall include a narrative of the 14 15 condition of the Transportation Department as well as forward 16 looking challenges and opportunities. The intent of this requirement is to allow the Joint Transportation Committee to 17 18 assist in avoiding future problems and challenges and to 19 assist in the development of goals for the Transportation 20 Department. This plan may be incorporated into the Annual 21 Report as required by Section 23-1-35, Code of Alabama 1975 or 22 be prepared as a separate document.

23 <u>"(5) The Transportation Department shall prepare and</u>
 24 <u>submit for review by the Joint Transportation Committee a</u>
 25 <u>comprehensive plan for the Department utilizing objective</u>
 26 <u>prioritization criteria consistent with the factors described</u>
 27 in subdivision (11) at the first quarterly meeting of the

1 year. The plan shall include a narrative of the condition of 2 the Transportation Department as well as forward looking challenges and opportunities. The intent of this requirement 3 is to allow the Joint Transportation Committee to assist in 4 5 avoiding future problems and challenges and to assist in the development of goals for the Transportation Department. This 6 7 plan may be incorporated into the Annual Report as required by Section 23-1-35, Code of Alabama 1975 or be prepared as a 8 9 separate document."

10 "(4) (6) It shall issue a report to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, House of Representatives, and Senate, and 11 12 public within 30 days of the first quarterly meeting the first 13 10 legislative days of each annual regular legislative 14 session, comparing actual performance of the Department of 15 Transportation Department in terms of highway construction, 16 maintenance, and costs of the same, to the original plan for 17 the immediate preceding fiscal year as well as the five 18 preceding fiscal years. It shall also make this report 19 available to the public within forty (40) days of the first 20 quarterly meeting.

"(5) (7) It shall recommend to the Governor
 necessary funding for Department of <u>future</u> Transportation
 <u>Department</u> budgets to the extent necessary beyond funds
 already provided by law.

"(6) (8) It may retain the services of outside
 consultants, if necessary, and consult with other groups and
 individuals, including public interest groups, interested

individuals, and appropriate departments of the University of
 Alabama, Auburn University, and other state educational
 institutions.

4 "(7) (9) It may hold public hearings, shall make
5 diligent inquiry and a full examination of the long-range
6 future highway needs of the state, and shall file all reports
7 of its findings and recommendations with both houses of the
8 Legislature and with the Governor.

9 "(8) (10) It may call witnesses and do all things
10 necessary or convenient in connection with and all things
11 incidental to performance of the foregoing duties and powers.

12 "(9) (11) In performing its functions, the Joint 13 Transportation Committee shall take into consideration, in 14 determining reviewing plans for highway construction and 15 maintenance, among other factors all of the following:

16 "a. Commuter benefits in the form of direct savings 17 to working men and women traveling to and from their jobs in 18 the state-;

"b. Industrial and agricultural growth-; 19 20 "c. Transportation safety-; 21 "d. Ecological impacts of transportation projects-; "e. Recreation and tourism-; 22 "f. Traffic density-; 23 24 "g. Implications on the routing of school buses; 25 "h. Implications on the operation of public safety and first responder vehicles; and 26

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"<u>i. Priority to projects in a location with an</u> independent local assessment.

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"§29-2-6.

"The Department of Transportation Department shall 4 5 cooperate with the Joint Transportation Committee and shall prepare or cause to be prepared and furnished to the Joint 6 7 Transportation Committee, by July 1 the third quarterly 8 meeting of each year, the current long-range five-year federal-aid highway plan, STIP for proposed highway 9 10 construction and any other reports, disclosures, information, or data requested by Joint Transportation Committee. and the 11 Department of Transportation's The Transportation Department's 12 13 proposed annual budgets, all as referred to in Section 29-2-4 14 for the next fiscal year shall be prepared and furnished to 15 the Joint Transportation Committee by the last quarterly 16 meeting of each year. The Department of Transportation 17 Department shall include in its current annual work program 18 sufficient projects to insure the complete utilization of all federal and state funds. It shall make available the books and 19 20 records of the <del>Department of</del> Transportation Department 21 necessary for the Joint Transportation Committee to perform 22 its functions and shall report to it quarterly on the 23 performance of the Department of Transportation Department for 24 the preceding fiscal quarter of the state and its proposed 25 projects and plans for the current fiscal year thereof. The Transportation Department shall maintain the STIP in 26 accordance with requirements set forth by the Federal Highway 27

1	Administration. Additionally, the Transportation Department
2	shall include narrative language for each project in the STIP
3	describing in detail the scope of the project and the reasons
4	for its placement in the STIP. Whenever the plan is amended
5	for any reason, the Transportation Department shall, within
6	seven calendar days of such amendment: (1) update the ALDOT
7	website to disclose the change(s) made to the plan and (2)
8	notify, in writing, the chair of the Joint Transportation
9	Committee of the change(s) made together with appropriate
10	explanation of the change(s). Upon written request from the
11	chair of the Joint Transportation Committee, the
12	Transportation Department shall provide copies of the notice
13	to all members of the Joint Transportation Committee.
14	"§29-2-8.
15	"All bills originating in either house pertaining to
16	highway projects transportation under the jurisdiction of the
17	Department of Transportation Department, its budget, and all

other matters of highway planning, construction, modification, 18 19 maintenance, operation, or administration shall be referred to 20 reviewed by the Joint Transportation Committee for its 21 recommendations and approval, which recommendations and 22 approval shall be given due consideration by the committees of 23 each house of the Legislature in acting on any related 24 legislation. Absent a recommendation from the Joint Transportation Committee, said committees shall proceed with 25 their consideration of legislation." 26

Section 2. Section 2. This act shall become
 effective immediately following its passage and approval by
 the Governor, or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
