15	least 20 years of law enforcement experience.			
16	"(2) SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER. A person who is			
17	certified by the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and			
18	Training Commission as a law enforcement officer, whose			
19	certification is in good standing, and who has the power of			
20	arrest.			
21	" (a) <u>(b)</u> A local board of education may employ			
22	persons as school security personnel or contract with a local			
23	chief of police or sheriff to employ school resource officers.			
24	A local board of education may allow any person employed by			
25	the board as school security personnel or as a school resource

1	officer to carry a firearm while on duty if the employee			
2	satisfies all of the following qualifications:

17	"(c) Nothing in this section confers upon any

19	" (b) <u>(d)</u> The State Department of Education shall

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
