8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, an all-terrain vehicle
9		(ATV) and a recreational off-highway vehicle are
10		off-road vehicles that may be registered by the
11		owner with the Alabama State Law Enforcement
12		Agency. An all-terrain vehicle is defined to
13		include a vehicle of not more than 50 inches in
14		width or more than 1,200 pounds. A recreational
15		off-highway vehicle is defined to include a vehicle
16		of not more than 72 inches in width or more than
17		2,000 pounds.
18		This bill would increase the authorized
19		width and weight of an all-terrain vehicle to not
20		more than 60 inches in width and not more than
21		1,500 pounds and would increase the authorized
22		width and weight of a recreational off-highway
23		vehicle to not more than 80 inches in width and not
24		more than 2,500 pounds.

7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:		
8	Section 1. Section 32-12A-1 of the Code of Alabama		
9	1975, is amended to read as follows:		
10	"§32-12A-1.		
11	"For purposes of this chapter, the following terms		
12	shall have the following meanings:		
13	"(1) ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES (ATV). Every motor vehicle		
14	$\frac{50}{60}$ inches or less in width, having a dry weight of $\frac{1,200}{1}$		
15	1,500 pounds or less, designed to travel on three or more		
16	non-highway tires, and manufactured for off-road use by a		
17	single operator or by an operator and not more than one		
18	passenger as provided by the manufacturer.		
19	"(2) OFF-ROAD VEHICLE. Any motorized vehicle not		
20	designed for use on a highway and capable of cross-country		
21	travel on land, snow, ice, marsh, swampland, or other natural		
22	terrain. The term includes any all-terrain vehicle and		
23	recreational off-highway vehicle. The term excludes any golf		
24	cart; any vehicle used for military, fire, emergency, or law		
25	enforcement purposes; any motorboat; any vehicles used		
26	exclusively on airport property; all farm machinery, farm		

tractors, and other self-propelled equipment for harvesting

and transportation of forest products, for clearing land for planting, for utility services and maintenance, for earth moving, construction, or mining; and self-propelled lawnmowers, snowblowers, and garden or lawn tractors while such vehicles are being used exclusively for their designed purposes. The term does not include any motor vehicle for

which a certificate of title is required by Chapter 8.

"(3) RECREATIONAL OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE. Any off-road vehicle 72 80 inches or less in width, having a dry weight of 2,000 2,500 pounds or less, designed and manufactured to travel on four or more non-highway tires for off-road use by an operator and the number of passengers as provided by the manufacturer.

"(4) SECRETARY. The Secretary of the Alabama State
Law Enforcement Agency."

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
