| 23 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: |
| 24 | Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited |
| 25 | as the Alabama Entrepreneurial Military Veteran Act. |
| 26 | Section 2. (a) For the purposes of this section, the |
| 27 | following terms shall have the following meanings: |

(1) VETERAN. A person who has served in the active duty military, naval, or air service, or who has served on continuous federalized active duty for at least 180 days or for the total period for which the person was ordered to active military duty, other than for purposes of active duty for training, and who was discharged or released therefrom under conditions other than dishonorable.

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- (2) VETERAN-OWNED BUSINESS. Any business entity, whether for profit or not-for-profit, in which a veteran, who is a resident of this state at the time of formation of the business entity, owns a controlling interest.
- (b) The Secretary of State or the Attorney General shall waive all filing fees and all other fees associated with the formation, organization, and operation of any new domestic business entity that qualifies as a veteran-owned business.
- (c) Any fee for an occupational license collected by any county or municipality shall be waived for the owner or organizer of any new veteran-owned business, whether for profit or not-for-profit, if the occupational license is required to operate the business. This subsection shall not be construed as providing a waiver of any fee for a professional license issued by this state.
- (d) The fee waivers provided under subsections (b) and (c) shall be available to a new veteran-owned business if the business entity was established or has an initial start-up date on or after January 1, 2019. The fee waivers shall remain in effect for a maximum period of three years after the

initial establishment, formation, or start-up date of the

veteran-owned business, as determined by the date on which the

business is formed or registered in accordance with state law

in the Office of the Secretary of State or Office of the

Attorney General.

- (e) The Secretary of State and the Attorney General shall adopt rules to establish eligibility and waiver of fee procedures under subsections (b) and (c), as well as to establish antifraud provisions to deter and penalize any business entity that is not majority owned or controlled by a veteran or veterans from falsely claiming veteran status in order to attempt to establish eligibility for the waiver or waivers.
- (f) Any veteran applying for a waiver of fees for the formation, organization, or operation of a veteran-owned business shall provide to the state agency, department, county, municipality, or other regulatory authority documentation as shall be required by the regulatory authority, as well as a copy of one of the following documents as proof of his or her veteran status in order to establish eligibility for any fee waivers under this section:
- (1) A valid United States Department of Defense Certificate of Discharge or Release from Active Duty (DD-214);
- (2) A valid Veterans Health Identification Card (VHIC) issued by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs; or

1 (3) A valid state issued driver's identification 2 card with veteran's designation.

- (g) The Secretary of State and the Attorney General shall provide general notice of the adoption of the Alabama Entrepreneurial Military Veteran Act and its provisions, at a minimum, by providing information via the agency's website describing the provisions of this section in order to assist veterans with applying for fee waivers provided under this section.
- (h) The Secretary of State and the Attorney General, as well as any county or municipality providing a fee waiver under subsections (b) and (c), shall submit an annual year-end report to the Chair of the House Ways and Means Committee and to the Chair of the Senate Fiscal Responsibility and Economic Development Committee, to include the number of waiver applications received, the number of waivers granted, and the aggregate dollar amount of all waivers granted to each eligible veteran-owned business.

Section 3. This act shall become effective January 1, 2020, following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
