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8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, it is unlawful to write,
9		send, or read a text-based communication using a
10		wireless telecommunications device while operating
11		a motor vehicle on a public road, street, or
12		highway, subject to certain penalties.
13		This bill would prohibit the use of a
14		wireless telecommunications device or other
15		stand-alone electronic device while operating a
16		motor vehicle and holding the device and would
17		provide penalties.
18		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
19		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
20		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
21		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
22		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
23		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
24		becoming effective with regard to a local
25		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
26		unless: it comes within one of a number of
27		specified exceptions; it is approved by the

affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates
funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

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Relating to motor vehicles; to amend Section 32-5A-350 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to prohibit the use of a wireless telecommunications device or other stand-alone electronic device while operating a motor vehicle on a public road, street, or highway; to provide exceptions; to provide penalties; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1	Section 1. Section 32-5A-350 of the Code of Alabama
2	1975, is amended to read as follows:
3	"§32-5A-350.
4	"(a) For purposes of this article, the following
5	words have the following meanings:
6	"(1) STAND-ALONE ELECTRONIC DEVICE. A device other
7	than a wireless telecommunications device which stores audio
8	or video data files to be retrieved on demand by a user.
9	" (1) (2) WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATION
10	${\tt TELECOMMUNICATIONS}$ DEVICE. A handheld cellular telephone, ${\tt a}$
11	portable telephone, a text-messaging device, a personal
12	digital assistant, a stand alone computer, a global
13	positioning system receiver, or any other similar portable
14	wireless device that is readily removable from a vehicle and
15	is used to write, send, or read text or data through manual
16	input initiate or receive communications, information, or
17	<u>data</u> . The term "wireless telecommunication telecommunications
18	device" does not include a device which is voice-operated and
19	which allows the user to send or receive a text-based
20	communication without the use of either hand except to
21	activate or deactivate a feature or function radio, citizens
22	band radio, citizens band radio hybrid, commercial two-way
23	radio communication device or its functional equivalent,
24	subscription based emergency communication device, prescribed
25	medical device, amateur or ham radio device, or in-vehicle
26	security, navigation, or remote diagnostics system.

1	" (2) WRITE, SEND, OR READ A TEXT-BASED
2	COMMUNICATION. Using a wireless telecommunication device to
3	manually communicate with any person using text-based
4	communication, including, but not limited to, communications
5	referred to as a text message, instant message, or electronic
6	mail. The term does not include reading, selecting, or
7	entering a telephone number or name in a cell or wireless
8	telephone or communication device for the purpose of making a
9	telephone call.
10	"(b) A person may not operate a motor vehicle on a
11	public road, street, or highway in Alabama while using a
12	wireless telecommunication device to write, send, or read a
13	text-based communication. A driver shall exercise due care in
14	operating a motor vehicle on a public road, street, or highway
15	of this state and may not engage in any actions which distract
16	the driver from the safe operation of the vehicle.
17	"(c) The driver of a motor vehicle may not do any of
18	<pre>the following:</pre>
19	"(1) Physically hold or support a wireless
20	telecommunications device with any part of his or her body.
21	This subdivision does not prohibit the use of an earpiece,
22	headphone device, or device worn on a wrist to conduct a voice
23	based communication.
24	"(2) Physically hold or support a stand-alone
25	electronic device with any part of his or her body.
26	"(3) Write, send, or read any text based
27	communication, including, but not limited to, a text message,

1	instant message, e-mail, or Internet data on a wireless
2	telecommunications device or stand-alone electronic device.
3	This subdivision does not apply to either of the following:
4	"a. A voice based communication which is
5	automatically converted by the device to be sent as a message
6	in a written form.
7	"b. The use of the device for navigation of the
8	vehicle or for global positioning system purposes.
9	"(4) Watch a video or movie on a wireless
10	telecommunications device or stand-alone electronic device
11	other than watching data related to the navigation of the
12	vehicle.
13	"(5) Record or broadcast a video on a wireless
14	telecommunications device or stand-alone electronic device.
15	This subdivision does not apply to electronic devices used for
16	the sole purpose of continuously recording or broadcasting a
17	video within or outside of the motor vehicle.
18	"(d) While operating a commercial motor vehicle on
19	any public road, street, or highway of this state, no person
20	shall do either of the following:
21	"(1) Use more than a single button on a wireless
22	telecommunications device to initiate or terminate a voice
23	communication.
24	"(2) Reach for a wireless telecommunications device
25	or stand-alone electronic device if the driver is no longer
26	seated in the driving position or properly restrained by a
27	safety belt.

1	"(e) Each violation of this section shall constitute
2	a separate offense.
3	"(c)(f) A person who violates subsection (b) this
4	<pre>section is subject to fines as follows:</pre>
5	"(1) Twenty-five dollars (\$25) Fifty dollars (\$50)
6	for a first violation.
7	"(2) Fifty dollars (\$50) One hundred dollars (\$100)
8	for a second violation.
9	"(3) Seventy-five dollars (\$75) One hundred fifty
10	dollars (\$150) for a third or subsequent violation.
11	"(g) Any person appearing before a court for a first
12	charge of violating subsection (e) who produces in court a
13	device or proof of purchase of a device that would allow the
14	person to comply with this section in the future shall not be
15	guilty of an offense. The court shall require the person to
16	affirm that he or she has not previously utilized the
17	privilege under this subsection.
18	"(d) (h) Law enforcement officers enforcing this
19	section may treat a violation of this section as the primary
20	or sole reason for issuing a citation to a driver.
21	" $\frac{(e)}{(i)}$ The following uses of <u>a</u> wireless
22	communication devices telecommunications device or stand-alone
23	electronic device shall not be subject to the restrictions in
24	this section:
25	"(1) An individual using a wireless communication
26	device to obtain emergency services including, but not limited
27	to, an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care

provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency or entity.

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- "(2) An individual using a wireless communication device while the motor vehicle is parked on the shoulder of the highway, road, or street.
 - "(3) An individual using a wireless communication device as a global positioning or navigation system to receive driving directions which has been pre-programmed with the desired coordinates. The programming of coordinates while operating a vehicle remains a violation of this section.
 - "(4) A law enforcement officer, firefighter,
 emergency medical services personnel, ambulance driver, or
 other similarly employed public safety first responder using a
 device during the performance of his or her official duties."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective October 1, 2020, following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
