18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. Section 13A-6-170, Code of Alabama 1975,
20	is amended to read as follows:
21	"§13A-6-170.
22	"(a) (1) Except as provided in subdivision (2), this
23	section applies to all of the following persons or
24	<pre>establishments:</pre>
25	"a. All persons owning any establishment that
26	requires <del>a liquor license or</del> <u>a retail</u> alcoholic beverage

1	license, and that does not also have a food or beverage
2	permit, or both <del>;</del> .
3	"b. All persons owning any hotel that has been cited
4	as a nuisance as defined in Sections 13A-12-110 to 13A-12-122,
5	inclusive; Section 6-5-140.
6	"c. All persons owning any massage parlor where an
7	employee has been cited with violating Section 45-13-41, or
8	where the establishment that has been cited as a nuisance as
9	defined in Section 6-5-140 <del>;</del>
10	"d. Any any airport, train station, rest area, rest
11	<pre>stop, or bus station; and.</pre>
12	"e. All persons owning any gas station.
13	"e. f. All persons owning any business that provides
14	entertainment commonly called stripteasing or topless
15	entertaining or entertainment that has employees who are not
16	clad both above and below the waist $\underline{.}$
17	"(2) This subsection does not apply to businesses
18	providing entertainment in theaters, concert halls, art
19	centers, museums, or similar establishments that are devoted
20	primarily to the arts or theatrical performances, when the
21	performances that are presented are expressing matters of
22	serious literary, artistic, scientific, or political value.
23	"(b) Any person subject to this section shall post
24	in a location conspicuous to the public at the entrance of the
25	business or where such posters and notices are customarily
26	posted, a poster of no smaller than 8 1/2 by 11 inches in size

that states  $\underline{\text{all of}}$  the following:

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""(1) If you or someone you know is being forced to 1 2 engage in any activity and cannot leave - whether it is commercial sex, housework, farm work, or any other activity -3 call the National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline at 4 5 1-888-373-7888 to access help and services. ""(1) (2) Victims of human trafficking are protected 6 7 under U.S. law. ""<del>(2)</del> (3) The Toll-free Hotline is: 8 ""a. Available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. 9 10 ""b. Operated by a nonprofit, nongovernmental organization. 11 ""c. Anonymous and confidential. 12 13 ""d. Accessible in 170 languages. ""e. Able to provide help, referral to services, 14 15 training, and general information." "This subsection shall not apply to businesses 16 17 providing entertainment in theaters, concert halls, art centers, museums, or similar establishments that are devoted 18 19 primarily to the arts or theatrical performances, when the 20 performances that are presented are expressing matters of 21 serious literary, artistic, scientific, or political value. "(b) (c) The poster shall be available on the 22 Internet website of all of the following: 23 24 "(1) The Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board 25 where documents associated with obtaining a liquor license or alcoholic beverage license are customarily located. 26

"(2) The Alabama Public Service Commission.

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"(3) The Alabama Department of Labor.

"(c) (d) The owners shall print the poster from any of the Internet websites in subsection (b) (c) or ask that the poster be mailed for the cost of printing and first class postage and post the sign in compliance with subsection (a) (b).

"(d) (e) The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, the Public Service Commission, and the Department of Labor shall post the sign on its Internet site in English, Spanish, and any other language deemed appropriate by the Commissioner of Labor. The owners shall obtain and post the posters in English, Spanish, and any other languages deemed appropriate by the Commissioner of Labor.

"(e) (f) The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, the Public Service Commission, and the Department of Labor shall provide each applicable business or establishment with notice of mandatory compliance of this section.

"(f) (g) (1) A person who violates this section shall be subject to a warning fine of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) on the first violation and a fine not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50) of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) for each subsequent violation. The violation or noncompliance with this section, and each day's continuance thereof, shall constitute a separate and distinct violation.

"(2) Funds collected under this section shall be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the Attorney

"(h) The Alabama Department of Labor in consultation with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board and the Public Service Commission, shall adopt rules to ensure licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, massage parlors, airports, train stations, rest areas, rest stops, bus stations, hotels, gas stations, and businesses that provide entertainment as referenced in paragraph (a) (1)e., comply with the provisions of this section and to further provide for enforcement of this section."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on January 1, 2020, following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
