18	enforcement trainees within the commissions jurisdiction.
19	(b) In addition to training required under
20	subsection (a), APOSTC, shall offer, and law enforcement
21	officers shall complete, one hour of continuing education
22	relating to human trafficking each year.
23	(c) Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training
24	Commission shall collaborate with organizations that
25	specialize in the recognition and prevention of human

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1 (d) Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training 2 Commission shall annually review and update the training to 3 include changes and trends in human trafficking.

January 1, 2020, following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
