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1 Relating to public water utilities; to amend Section 2 37-4-2.1, Code of Alabama 1975, to provide further for the regulation of certain private water system utilities in Class 3 8 municipalities. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 5 Section 1. Section 37-4-2.1, Code of Alabama 1975, 6 7 is amended to read as follows: "§37-4-2.1. 8 9 "(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any 10 private water system utility which that serves less than 1,000 customers and purchases its water from a municipal water 11 12 system in a Class 8 municipality, upon petition to and 13 approval from the municipality from which it purchases its 14 water, may elect to be exempt from all regulation of the 15 Public Service Commission and subject to regulation by the municipality from which it purchases its water in the manner 16 set forth in this section. 17 18 "(b) An initial election under this section shall be 19 effective upon filing of a written notification to the Public 20 Service Commission and the municipality approval of a 21 resolution by the municipality and upon submission of the 22 approval to the Public Service Commission., and The election 23 shall remain effective until and unless revoked in the same 24 manner the approval of the municipality, by resolution, is 25 revoked, and the revocation is submitted to the Public Service Commission. 26

"(c) Any private water system utility making an 1 2 election under this section may maintain its rates and charges 3 which that are in effect at the time of the election without 4 further approval from the municipality. The municipality shall 5 thereafter approve any changes in rates and charges for the 6 private water system utility that are fair, just, and 7 reasonable to the water system and the customers. Approval of the changes may be set forth in a water purchase agreement 8 between the private water system and the municipality, or by 9 10 other written means, and may allow for prospective rate 11 adjustments based on specified criteria."

12 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 13 first day of the third month following its passage and 14 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
