BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

"Section 65.

"Part I.

"Except as provided in Part II, the The legislature shall have no power to authorize lotteries or gift enterprises for any purposes, and shall pass laws to prohibit the sale in this state of lottery or gift enterprise tickets, or tickets in any scheme in the nature of a lottery; and, except as provided in Part II, all acts, or parts of acts heretofore passed by the legislature of this state, authorizing a lottery or lotteries, and all acts amendatory thereof, or supplemental thereto, are hereby avoided.

"Part II.

"Section 1. Declarations. The Legislature finds that lotteries have been enacted in many states and the revenues generated from those lotteries have contributed to the benefit of those states. Many Alabamians already participate in other

1	state lotteries. Therefore, the purpose of the proposed
2	amendment is to establish and provide for a lottery statewide
3	to generate revenue for the state.
4	"Section 2. Establishment of an Alabama Lottery.
5	"(a) The Legislature, by general law, shall provide
6	for the establishment, administration, operation, and
7	regulation of an Alabama Lottery consistent with this part.
8	"(b) Each fiscal year, the proceeds from the Alabama
9	Lottery shall be applied first to the payment of the expenses
10	of administering and operating the Alabama Lottery, including,
11	without limitation, the payment of all prizes, without any
12	further appropriation required by law, and the balance of the
13	proceeds remaining after the payments shall be deposited in
14	the Alabama Trust Fund for the repayment of transfers made to
15	the State General Fund in the fiscal years 2013, 2014 and
16	<u>2015.</u>
17	(c) Upon full repayment of the transfers mentioned
18	in subsection (b), the balance of proceeds remaining after the
19	payment of the expenses of administering and operating the
20	Alabama Lottery in each fiscal year shall be distributed as
21	<pre>follows:</pre>
22	"(1) one-half of the remaining proceeds shall be
23	deposited into the Alabama Trust Fund;
24	"(2) the remaining proceeds shall be deposited into
25	the state General Fund.
26	"(d) The lottery games authorized by this part shall
27	be limited to the sale of paper tickets for various intrastate

1	and multistate or multisovereign lottery games and instant
2	tickets, but specifically excluding any form of "video
3	lottery" or use of "video lottery terminal" as defined or any
4	<pre>mobile or Internet-based or monitor-based interactive game, or</pre>
5	any simulated casino-style game, including video poker, video
6	roulette, slot machines or video blackjack, or any variant of
7	these prohibited games.
8	"(e) "Instant tickets" authorized by this part shall
9	mean a lottery game in which a player manipulates a paper
10	ticket to determine if the player has won.
11	"(f) "Video lottery" or "video lottery terminal"
12	excluded by this part shall mean any electronic interactive
13	game, machine, or device equipped with a video screen and
14	buttons, keys, a keyboard, touchscreen or other input method
15	allowing input by an individual player and into which the
16	player inserts coins, tokens, currency, or other
17	representation of value (including, but not limited to, an
18	electronic card, ticket, or other thing on which value is
19	electronically recorded) as consideration in order for play of
20	a game, the player may receive free games, credits (redeemable
21	for cash or noncash prize), or some other thing of value,
22	whether received directly from the device or otherwise,
23	determined wholly or predominantly by chance.
24	"(g) The legislature shall enact legislation
25	regulating the control, management, and operation of the

<u>lottery.</u>

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1	"(h) Nothing in this amendment affects, prohibits,
2	or limits any activity which was legal at the time this
3	amendment becomes effective."
4	END OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT
5	Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment
6	shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the
7	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284
8	and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
9	Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this
10	state on March 3, 2020.
11	Section 3. The appropriate election official shall
12	assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
13	amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the
14	following description of the substance or subject matter of
15	the proposed constitutional amendment:
16	"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of
17	Alabama of 1901, to establish an Alabama Lottery; to provide
18	for the sale of lottery tickets utilizing paper tickets or
19	receipts, including instant tickets and multi-state lottery
20	games; to provide for the distribution of lottery proceeds;
21	and to require the Legislature to pass general laws to
22	implement the amendment.
23	"Proposed by Act"
24	This description shall be followed by the following
25	language:
