20	"(1) Two of the members shall be appointed by the

22	shall be appointed by the municipal governing body of the
23	authorizing municipality. All of these members shall be
24	residents of the authorizing municipality and water customers
25	of the board.
26	"(2) One additional board member shall be appointed
27	by the association of mayors in the county where the

authorizing municipality is located if there is an organized 1 2 incorporated countywide association of mayors or by the mayors of the county acting jointly if not. This member shall 3 hereafter be referred to as the board member appointed by the 4 5 association of mayors. The board member shall reside outside of the corporate limits of the authorizing municipality and 6 7 shall be a resident of the county where the authorizing 8 municipality is principally located and be a water customer of 9 the board. Notwithstanding any other provision of this 10 division, the person appointed as a board member by the association of mayors may only serve one full term on the 11 board. 12

13 "(3) One additional board member shall be appointed by the county commission of each county other than the county 14 15 where the authorizing municipality is principally located where more than 5,000 25,000 water customers are served by the 16 17 board or where the board owns a major reservoir located 18 entirely within the county. The term of a member who has been 19 appointed by the county commission of a county in which the 20 board owns a major reservoir located entirely within the 21 county prior to the effective date of the act adding this sentence shall expire on the effective date of the act. Each 22 board member shall be a resident of the county making the 23 24 appointment."

25 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 26 first day of the third month following its passage and

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approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law. At
that time the water board will reorganize.
