10 TO BE ENTITLED
11 AN ACT
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13 To authorize the City Council of the City of Hoover
14 in Jefferson County and Shelby County, pursuant to Amendment
15 No. 373 of the Constitution of Alabama 1901, to increase the
16 rate of the ad valorem tax levied and collected on all taxable
17 property in the city which is authorized pursuant to the
18 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, by an additional 2.4 mills on
19 each dollar (\$0.24 on each one hundred dollars) of assessed
20 value to be used exclusively for public school purposes.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

22 Section 1. This act shall apply to the City of
23 Hoover in Jefferson County and Shelby County.

24 Section 2. For the purposes of this act, the
25 following words have the following meanings:

1 (1) AMENDMENT NO 373. Amendment No. 373 of the
2 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 217
3 of the Recompiled Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

4 (2) CITY. The City of Hoover, Alabama.

5 (3) CITY GENERAL AD VALOREM TAX. The tax authorized
6 pursuant to the applicable provisions of the general laws of
7 this state and the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to be
8 levied by the city for general municipal purposes including
9 public school purposes.

10 Section 3. The city presently levies and collects
11 the city general ad valorem tax. Pursuant to a resolution
12 adopted by the City Council of the City of Hoover after a
13 public hearing in accordance with Amendment No. 373, the City
14 of Hoover proposes to increase the rate at which it may levy
15 and collect the city general ad valorem tax by an additional
16 2.4 mills (\$0.24 on each one hundred dollars) of assessed
17 value for public school purposes.

18 Section 4. Pursuant to subsection (f) of Amendment
19 No. 373 and a resolution adopted by the City Council of the
20 City of Hoover after a public hearing, the city may increase
21 the rate at which the city levies and collects the town
22 general ad valorem tax by a maximum rate increase for any tax
23 year equal to 2.4 mills (\$0.24 on each one hundred dollars) of
24 assessed value, to be used and expended exclusively for public
25 school purposes.

26 Section 5. The increase in the rate at which the
27 city general ad valorem tax may be levied and collected

1 pursuant to this act is subject to approval by a majority of
2 the qualified electors residing in the city who vote on the
3 proposed increase at a special election called and held for
4 that purpose pursuant to subsection (f) of Amendment No. 373.

5 Section 6. This act shall become effective
6 immediately following its passage and approval by the
7 governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
