1 relating to temporary assignment of circuit or district 2 judges, to repeal provisions prohibiting the Chief Justice of 3 the Supreme Court of Alabama from assigning a circuit or district judge from Jefferson County to serve within another 4 5 judicial circuit or district court and prohibiting the 6 presiding Judge of Jefferson County from assigning a circuit 7 or district court judge within the county to serve within the circuit or district court within the county.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 12-9A-7 and 12-9A-8, Code of Alabama 1975, as added by Act 2018-567, 2018 Regular Session, are amended to read as follows:

"\$12-9A-7.

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- "(a) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Alabama, by order, shall assign a circuit or district judge from a judicial circuit to serve within another judicial circuit for a reasonable period of time to address court congestion, court delay, civil and criminal backlog of cases, or for any other reason necessary for the prompt and thorough administration of justice.
- "(b) When considering the amount of time a judge may be assigned from his or her home circuit to another circuit, the Chief Justice shall take into consideration all relevant circumstances regarding the judicial needs of the circuits involved.
- "(c) A judge assigned to serve another circuit under subsection (a) shall be reimbursed for any necessary and

reasonable expenses of travel and the same maintenance expense allowances from the State Treasury that the judge would be entitled to receive when attending court or transacting other official business outside of the judge's home circuit.

"(d) This section shall not apply in Jefferson County.

"\$12-9A-8.

- "(a) A presiding circuit judge, by order, may assign a circuit or district court judge who is within the circuit to serve within the circuit or within the district courts of the circuit. Before assigning a judge, the presiding circuit judge shall evaluate the needs of the circuit, including the currency, congestion, and backlog of criminal and civil cases.
- "(b) Assignments of judges by the presiding circuit judge shall be in writing and shall be sent to the assigned judge as soon as practicable. The presiding judge or the judge's designee may notify the assigned judge orally of the assignment. An oral notification of an assignment is sufficient until a written notification can be prepared and delivered to the assigned judge. A copy of each written assignment shall be filed with the Administrative Director of Courts and in the office of the clerk or register of the court to which the assignment is made.
- "(c) Except as otherwise provided by law or rule, the presiding judge may assign judicial secretaries, bailiffs, and court reporters in the judicial system within the circuit

to service in the circuit or district court as the service may 1 2 be required. 3 "(d) This section shall not apply in Jefferson 4 County. "(e)(d) It is the intent of the Legislature that 5 pursuant to Amendment 328 of the Constitution of Alabama of 6 7 1901, now appearing as Section 150 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as 8 amended, the Supreme Court of Alabama shall amend Rule 13 of 9 10 the Alabama Rules of Judicial Administration to conform with 11 the provisions of this section." 12 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the

first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
